A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

I was overjoyed when I read on Facebook and then in about 20 articles about the reading of Torah at the Kotel on Rosh Chodesh Iyar by Nashot Hakotel—Women of the Wall. What made this moment extraordinary is that it was women reading from the Torah. Women have been prohibited from doing this by the rabbi who oversees the rules and regulations at the Kotel. At that Rosh Chodesh service, a man took one of the one hundred Torah scrolls that are found on the men's side of the mechitzah and secretly handed it through a gate to women on the women's side who danced and sang and read from the scroll for the first time ever. The man who did this was beaten by Orthodox Jewish men and arrested by the police.

At Rosh Chodesh Sivan, the next month after Iyar, things weren't the same. Temporary barriers were put up so that the same passing of a Torah couldn't take place and six girls who had prepared to read from a Torah for their bat mitzvah at the Kotel were denied access to a Torah. Shameful. Shame on the Orthodox Jewish authority who believe that they hold the rules handed down from Sinai. Shame on the rabbi of the wall who denies Jewish women the opportunity to fulfill the mitzvah of reading Torah. The Kotel belongs to every Jew and reading Torah is the right of every Jew.

I know I've written and spoken about this subject on several different occasions, but equal rights for all Jews in public places, especially Jewish holy sites that all of us have a connection and right to, is critical for the Jew of the modern day world. We can be a Judaism of different denominations. Orthodoxy and Reform meet the spiritual needs of different Jews in this world. My issue is when one side tries to hold up the rites of the other side. Telling Jewish women that they should sit separately from men. Demanding that Shabbat be observed according to their proscriptions. Denying Jewish women the opportunity to do something which is right in the eyes of so many women like reading from a Torah scroll at the Kotel. Telling me that I can't stand with my wife at the Kotel to offer a prayer and remember those who brought us here.

I am so proud of the opportunities Reform Judaism has opened up to all Jews. We affirm the rights of women. We affirm the rights of all people including LGBTQ. We believe in marriage equality. We affirm reproductive rights. We work to end the challenges of so many in this world through Tikkun Olam—repairing the world.

Chadash News

Chadash Planning in the Summer School may be out for the summer, but there is still a lot going on at Chadash in preparation for next year! The office staff is working on getting the registration materials out to parents so that they have the option of registering their children early in the summer, before setting off on vacations and camp.

I have been meeting with the teachers and with the Chadash Committee to evaluate this past school year, we're identifying areas in which the curriculum and instruction was very effective, and also areas in which there could be improvement. Students in grades 3-7 have anonymously taken assessments of Judaics knowledge at the end of each of the

past three years, and we are using the data from those assessments to see specifically where the curriculum can be strengthened. We're also looking at class sizes and deciding on the most effective groupings for the students.

We have established the school calendar for the coming year, and we are already hard at work planning special school holiday programs, including family programs. This year there will also be an intensive community effort to consolidate activities and avoid duplication of effort, so we will be looking to partner with other organizations in the community on the planning and implementation of some of these programs.

Several of the classes went on field

trips last year, and we are working on being able to take some of our students to new and exciting places in the area to enrich their Jewish learning.

Wells began his singing career with folk and folk/rock music in college, with Pete Seeger being a continued favorite for him through the years.

Pete and his music showed that, although he loved his country, he was not afraid to sing about what he thought would make it better. He was a key figure in the folk music movements from the 30's to the 60's. He and his music made you love your country; however, at the time he was attacked for his beliefs and was censored from performing some of his material on television.

Music is included that everyone remembers and can sing along with, but also some that may not be so well known—and should be.

Charita, well known for her writing skills and many awards, will reveal details of Seeger's life throughout the program. "Pete Seeger is more than a musician; he's an American hero whose story deserves to be told. As someone who loves history, I was honored at the invitation to be a part of it." A former Cabaret production that featured Charita in a storytelling role was about singer, Hank Williams.
