A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

What do we make of the recent election in Israel? I was in Philadelphia at my Reform Rabbis annual conference. As the results became known, there was widespread disappointment and concern for the present and future. I have always been center-left in my connection to Israeli politics and for the most part have watched that side of the equation diminish while the center-right and extreme right have captured the narrative focusing on more than security, but taking over the West Bank.

I know that not everyone who reads this article whether a Temple Israel member or not will agree with me, but that is okay. I would invite someone with a differing viewpoint to write a response or to submit something to our Stark Jewish News. Since this is my column I need to express my views on how I see the recent election and prognosticate on the future.

I am a modern age Zionist. I love the fact that there is a State of Israel. I support the State of Israel. I will continue to lead trips to the State of Israel so that others can experience the wonder, beauty, history and modern creation of this miraculous place. I don't live in Israel, which means that I can't vote, but I am a Jew which gives me every right to share my opinion.

Israel is becoming divided in many of the same ways that we see between Republicans and Democrats in this country. It isn't the same issues, but the division is deep. On the right side of center the issue is the security of the state. This includes anything from a one-state solution where Israel controls everything to maintaining the current situation, but expanding settlements. The issues of a nuclear Iran, Hezbollah, and Hamas are the agenda items. On the left of center are the socio-economic concerns that dominate the rest of the discussion: the cost of food, housing, human rights, and inclusion. There are two parts of the equation that shouldn't be ignored and that is the growing Arab bloc and vote that reached 12-13 votes this year from a population that is now 20% of the country. I believe this bloc will continue to grow. The other part is the religious parties whose goal is receiving government support and trying to make the Jewish State of Israel more Jewish. The Arab party won't join any coalition at this time and the religious parties will join any coalition that welcomes them as long as they get what they want.

It is a very confusing political system.

I believe that security is important, but that Israel must work on its internal issues more fiercely. I believe in a two-state solution, as does most of the center-left. The center-right seems to be giving lip service at best to a two-state solution or complete rejection of the idea. I think that this new coalition, whatever it may be, will not last the four years and with it leaning right will only find Israel much more isolated from the rest of the world. I don't think this scenario is good for Israel or good for the Jews.

Let's hope that I am wrong and that the new government will find a way and a partner to make peace in the Middle East and to begin to solve the widening socio-economic gap and tremendous hardships for young Israelis.
