## A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

Let me begin by saying that on **April 8, at 7:30 pm, Lesley Sachs, Director of Women of the Wall** will speak at our Erev Shabbat Service. We are truly blessed to have her join us and thank you to the Temple Brotherhood and Sisterhood, and our own congregation for sponsoring her.

Last month I wrote to you about Nashot HaKotel—Women of the Wall. They had won a great victory in getting the Israeli Knesset to vote affirmatively on a bill that would dedicate the portion of the Western Wall area known as Robinson's Arch for an egalitarian prayer space. Since then there have been three significant responses to this hard won victory: the Haredi head of the Kotel Plaza, archeologists, and a splinter group of the Women of the Wall.

Just recently, Rabbi Rabinowitz, the ultra-Orthodox Haredi head of the Kotel Plaza area has now dialed back any support for the egalitarian space. Where many Orthodox Jewish leaders were okay with this new space, which is south of the current traditional area, Rabbi Rabinowitz is not. He would rather see the fight continue than allow for a positive compromise. Other Orthodox leaders believe that moving the Reform/Conservative population away from the traditional site would diminish the tension and allow those who wish to pray as "Jews" be done without confrontation. Despite the fact that there is no tradition for the separation of men and women at the Kotel or any prohibition traditionally from women praying together there, this new Haredi leadership continues to do everything it can to promote separation and embrace control.

Archeologists in Israel spoke about a different issue on the same problem. The area being considered for this egalitarian space (and, fyi, something is already constructed there, but it isn't practical for larger groups) is the southwestern part of the wall and on the other side of the ramp leading up to the former temple mount. Archeologists wrote a scathing letter that anything done in this area near Robinson's Arch would destroy the integrity of the space. They may be right, but I say this without seeing any plans. This area holds some important history for the Jewish people and if the sightline is blocked or degraded by any construction, it may hurt the site. I haven't heard much more about the archeologists' letter, but I am sure it hasn't been thrown away.

Finally, when Women of the Wall began 27 years ago it wasn't only made up of liberal Jews. There were many Orthodox women who were a part of the founding of the group who were fighting for the right to be observant women at the wall.

They wanted to pray and sing and read Torah at this holy place. The Orthodox leadership of the Kotel forbade all of this to them. They have never backed down from their original demands and are not interested in moving to Robinson’s Arch. They view the compromises accepted by the rest of Women of the Wall as sidestepping the original demands and accepting much less. The answer to all of this is the goal or goals of egalitarian prayer, women’s prayer, and archeology at the spiritual center of the world. When Lesley Sachs is here with us, we should ask her and maybe she will teach us.
