A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

The first seder for the festival of Pesach begins on Monday evening, April 10. The liberal Jewish community and Jews in Israel observe the holiday for seven days. This year it will conclude on Monday evening, April 17. During this seven day period, along with the seder on the first night (or the first two nights for some), we make dietary changes to place us in the historical mindset of our ancestors on their journey from slavery to freedom. The Torah does not tell us exactly which grains can be chametz, but the rabbis filled in this missing piece by determining that these five grains—wheat, rye, oats, barley and spelt—cannot be consumed unless they are prepared in an unleavened state. All of these grains react to water by beginning to rise.

As a result of the prohibition of eating these grains, we remove anything that has them in their ingredients. Breads and pasta are obvious, but certain oils and vinegars may contain products from these grains as well. As liberal Jews, we determine on our own how far we go in avoiding these grains from the overt to the covert.

In the Middle Ages, new prohibitions sprang up. *Kitniyot* or legumes were prohibited. Rice was prohibited. At some point, corn must have been prohibited as well. Personally, I have come to decide that avoiding the five grains in all their forms is enough for me. These rules have no basis and detract from the depth and meaning of this holiday.

On the other hand, what is most important at Pesach is not the food, but the story. One can wonder and speculate on the plagues and whether they happened or not. One can wonder and speculate on the Red Sea splitting or not, but if you don't worry about Truth with a capital T and focus on the truth of what the story is trying to teach, you will find it all the more engaging. Pesach is the story of our people's journey from slavery to freedom. Yes, the story has wonders of might and battles between God and Pharaoh, but in the end, this story is about putting one foot in front of another and walking forward and into the sea which splits and lets us get to the other side. We are sensitive to the pain others suffered for us to gain our freedom. We are sensitive to those who doubted the journey. We are sensitive to our leader who seems pained to have to do this work, but whose reluctance leads us forward.

So we celebrate with songs and prayers and special foods and memories. We laugh and are pensive. We eat and relax and drink some wine. In the end, we may feel as if we also made this journey to freedom. Next year in Jerusalem and next year may all be free.

A Message from The President

Why is this year different from all other years? On all other years, I think about Passover as a time for family and food, for remembering those no longer at our table, and for celebrating the new arrivals. This year, with reports of Jewish cemetery desecration, vandalized synagogues, and blatant acts of anti-Semitism around the world, I find myself thinking about freedom and what it means to be free.

Last November, I had a conversation with a friend who happens to be Muslim. We were discussing her challenge as a parent of young children, of how to help them process what they were hearing, of helping them feel safe and secure at a time when they were expressing fear. In January, I reached out to my friend to express my support and concern for her and her family who hail from one of the countries on the original travel ban list.

Now, she and others at the Mosque have reached out to our community to show the same type of support and concern. We have received emails and calls from the faith community in which people have expressed their concern and sadness over the hate in the world.

Recently, in my Temple mailbox, I found an envelope addressed to "The Beautiful People of Temple Israel." In it was a letter from the Rev. Heather Haginduff, Associate Minister for Youth and Families and Co-leader of Merge Collaborative Youth Ministry at Trinity United Church of Christ. The Rev. Haginduff explained that "Merge" is a collective of six youth groups that come together to "laugh, play, serve, and pray together."

At one gathering, the young people learned about the three types of love in the Bible: romantic, friendship, and unconditional. As an act of their unconditional love, they wrote valentines to Temple Israel "to show our support of you and your community in these challenging political times."

One signed "Christian Leader" reads:

"Fellow Humans,

We love you! You are loved by many people in Canton who support you as a creation to this beautiful world. I pray for God's peace, love, hope, joy, and harmony as humans. We love you!"

Another reads:

"Hello, my name is Anne, and I am 16. I understand that your community is receiving a lot of hate. But, know that I am here for you and I stand with you, even though we have a different faith. I LOVE YOU and YOU ARE LOVED. Together we can battle the darkness and bring the light into the world again. When one is hurt, we are all hurt. STAY STRONG!!! YOU ARE NOT ALONE."

There are more; you get the idea. What a lovely surprise these notes proved to be. I think that we sometimes underestimate the power of outreach and support. A quick note, a phone call, words of support go a long way to helping a person – or an entire community – know that they are not alone. Know that You and We are not alone.
