A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

This is not at all what I thought I would be writing about in this issue of our Bulletin. I thought I would be mentioning our newly designed website that Pat Downes has worked so hard to revamp. I thought I would be writing about the upcoming holy days. Maybe I would mention my week at woodworking camp. Instead, I am writing with pain in my heart about the war raging between Hamas and Israel. When will this end? When will I be able to write about peace and friendship and cooperation and a future, instead of death and destruction?

We all grieved when the three Israeli teens were kidnapped and found murdered. Our hearts cried out to the Palestinian family who lost a child in an act of revenge. This long, never-ending conflict has brought many similar tragedies to too many families for 100 years, but it doesn't lessen the anguish when it needlessly happens again and again. At the same time, we wondered where the outcry was from the Palestinian community about the three deaths when many in the Israeli community sent their condolences to the Palestinian family.

And then rockets from Gaza began increasing in intensity and range. Not one or two, but hundreds and after a week, a thousand. Aimed at cities filled with Muslims and Jews and holy sites belonging to both sides. Hamas didn't care, it just wanted to terrorize Israelis. So Israel struck back trying to destroy the Hamas infrastructure and leadership, but civilians, living right next to the rocket launches died too. A cease-fire—rejected by Hamas. A cease-fire for humanitarian reasons, broken by Hamas mortar fire and an attempted infiltration through tunnels dug into Israel. This is only going to get worse.

In 1957, Golda Meir said, "Peace will come when the Arabs will love their children more than they hate us." In 1969, she said, "When peace comes, we will perhaps in time be able to forgive the Arabs for killing our sons, but it will be harder for us to forgive them for having forced us to kill their sons." This is how I, an American Jew, feel each time we fight. True, I am not there firing a gun or dropping a bomb, but I still hate the fact that my brothers and sisters in Israel do this and, even more, need to do this. It is time for all of this to stop.

Basic Judaism & Introduction to Hebrew Classes

Beginning the end of October on Thursday evenings, Rabbi Adland will offer two classes: Basic Judaism and Introduction to Hebrew. Both classes will begin on October 30. The Basic Judaism class will have 12 sessions and the Introduction to Hebrew class will run for twenty-two sessions.

Basic Judaism will begin at 6:30 p.m. and conclude at 7:25 p.m. This class is designed to paint broad strokes of living a Jewish life and what a Jew believes. It is a wonderful beginner's course or a refresher for those who can't remember what they learned in religious school. The cost for this class is \$40 which covers the texts used.

Introduction to Hebrew will begin at 7:30 p.m. and conclude at 8:30 p.m. This class will take the Hebrew novice from knowing no Hebrew or just a little to being able to read many of our regularly used Hebrew prayers, as well as the meaning of some of the words. The cost for this class is \$35 which covers the texts used.

Dates for both classes are: October 30; November 6, 13, and 20; December 4, 11, and 18; January 8, 15, 22, and 29; and February 5. The Hebrew class will continue meeting at 6:30 p.m. on February 26; March 5, 19, and 26; April 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30; and May 7.
