A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

Is it good for Israel or is it bad for Israel? The P5+1 negotiations with Iran over the dismantling of Iran's ability to build a nuclear bomb have left most of us perplexed. If you listen to the pundits, the various parties involved, the tangential parties, the lobbying parties, and to every op-ed or editorial being written, the only clear, concise answer you can draw is that "I am so confused." In many ways, it depends on the question being asked. If you listen to President Obama, these negotiations were simply about keeping Iran from building a nuclear bomb. If you listen to AIPAC, then you hear many other issues that needed to be addressed and weren't decided in the right way.

In Israel, a country so politically divided that the current government holds the narrowest of a majority, we find that the message from almost every party is that this is a bad deal. Israel, as do many others, believes that without a better plan for inspections and verification that Iran will possess the bomb as soon as the agreement ends. The Israeli government, AIPAC and many others believe that the releasing of funds to Iran, \$150 billion of the \$450 billion that is now frozen, will find its way to terrorist organizations that will attack Israel and further destabilize the Middle East. Many believe that this deal will raise the level of the arms race in the Middle East and other countries will seek to build or purchase nuclear weapons to defend themselves against Iranian aggression. All of this sounds quite dire.

On the other hand, this isn't how the negotiators believe that this deal will play out. They believe that the rules and inspections set in place will severely limit Iran's ability to build a nuclear weapon. They believe that the economic sanctions have been so crippling to Iran that this cash isn't going to be used outside the country, but within its borders. They believe that this is to moderate Iranian politics and enable better people to ascend to leadership positions so we won't be in this position again.

I am not a prophet nor a pundit and I don't really know which is the right path. Passionate people will skew the facts and conversation in their direction so that the other side of the fence isn't visible at all. I do know this, the lobbying efforts in Congress by those who are against this deal will be loud and costly. President Obama will veto Congress' attempt to deny this deal. The Senate will vote to override the veto, but I am not sure that the House will. The deal will probably become reality and then we will see. Prime Minister Netanyahu will try and convince the world
