A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

In July, liberal and progressive Judaism suffered serious blows inflicted by the Haredi (ultra) Orthodox community which is aligned with the Netanyahu government. The impact of these decisions attacked the legitimacy of non-Orthodox Judaism and caused liberal and progressive movements and their members great distress in the diaspora. I am still reeling from these actions and, for the first time, feel as if the Israeli government is driving a huge wedge between itself and non-Orthodox Jews around the world.

In essence, here are the two actions taken in early July. First, after more than 25 years of seeking the right to pray fully as Jewish women at the Kotel (the Western Wall) and after the current government led by Prime Minister Netanyahu promised to create a real and viable egalitarian prayer space where a) men and women could pray together at the Kotel and b) women could have a service, read from the Torah and celebrate their Jewish lives without the vitriol of the Haredi Orthodox Jewish community shouting at them, spitting at them, and making their worship experience unpleasant that promise and the legislation that accompanied it was cancelled. The deafening uproar from the Diaspora Jewish community and deeply involved and committed Zionist Jews was so loud that the Prime Minister chose to delay any action for six months. (In my humble opinion, he is just trying to bury this, but it won't go away.) Then, within a few short days, legislation was passed disenfranchising any non-Orthodox rabbis or even not formally approved Orthodox rabbis from doing conversions in Israel. Once again this just says that if you aren't like us Haredi then you really aren't Jewish.

As I mentioned, the world-wide condemnation of these acts has been loud and forceful. I am a Zionist who loves Israel, but I am not willing to stay silent when her leaders are acting in unjust and un-Jewish ways. I will continue to support Israel, but from now on my monetary support will go to organizations and institutions that support the liberal and progressive Jewish agenda in Israel. A Message from The President

A Tribute to Ellie (and Alan and Jeri)

Just after Mother's Day, I learned of the death of Ellie Geier (Eleanor Sebrans). Canton "old-timers" will remember her as an active member of our Temple, community, and former editor of the Stark Jewish News; wife of Bob z"l; mother of Mitch, Amy and Jeff; daughter of former JCC Director Leonard Sebrans z"l and his wife Mabel z"l; sister of Carolyn z"l and Bill.

With the exception of my family, Ellie may have been my greatest cheerleader (rivaled only by TYG Advisors Jeri and Alan Meltzer). Ellie was first to hire me to babysit her children. Ellie took me to the theater and encouraged me to sing and dance and have fun on stage even if I wasn't "leading lady" material. Ellie encouraged me to write and to pursue my dream of becoming a theater critic (or at least a journalist). Ellie hired me to provide the entertainment at her children's birthday parties. Ellie encouraged me to cook and bake in her kitchen despite the mauve-colored icing that I got all over the place. Ellie taught me about the cycle of life when she left me alone with her children and the dog that decided to deliver her puppies on my watch. Ellie gave me relationship advice and was my confidant and friend. Ellie took my "secrets" to her grave, and I loved her for all of it.

We laughed together... a lot. We cried together... sometimes, and we kept in touch through an unlikely 50-year friendship. She was my mentor and one of my adult "go to" people to whom I wasn't related. I knew she would always have my back. She inspired me to be that person for children and teens in our community.

I am, in part, who I am today because of the way Ellie allowed me to experience life's lessons with the knowledge that she was nearby. Ellie's lessons of life coupled with the lessons of leadership and family unconditional love that were modeled by Alan and Jeri, are the reason I chose to work with youth in our Temple and in our Movement. They are the reason I found the courage to try new things that pushed me out of my comfort zone. They were all a part of the Temple Israel "Village" who helped to raise me.

I believed that I could one day serve as a youth advisor and maybe even President of Temple Israel because Ellie and Alan and Jeri believed in me; trusted me; allowed me the freedom to try and then try again.

I hope that you have an Ellie or an Alan or a Jeri in your life; I encourage you to tell them. Ellie knew that I loved her and appreciated her; I'm so glad nothing is left unsaid. May her memory be for a blessing.
