**Josephus & the Bible program December 2**

Chris Seeman of Walsh University will present a free program on "Josephus and the Bible" on Tuesday, December 2 at 7:30 p.m. at Beit Ha'am.

The Jewish historian Flavius Josephus is the most important eye-witness to Jewish life and thought at the dawn of the Common Era. His writings give insight into how Jews understood the Tanach as well as how the early Christians understood Jesus. Learning about Josephus is a great opportunity for Jews and Christians today to deepen their understanding of one another's faiths.

## From the President

Last month's article ended with the outbreak of World War II and our plans for remodeling or new construction put on hold. With victory in 1945 a new era began for our Temple. The twenty-two year tenure of Rabbi Latz ended and Rabbi George Lieberman was hired to lead our congregation. We had grown to over two hundred families and needed to have an early and late service for the High Holy Days with a student Rabbi to assist. There was no doubt that we had outgrown our space and needed a new building and monies were collected for its construction. As is usually the case when a new Rabbi is hired, Rabbi Lieberman was putting his brand on Temple life. There were more ceremonial observances and our service was enhanced by congregational singing. As a committed Zionist, he made our congregation more aware of its place as part of world Jewry. Just as things seemed to be going so well, tragedy struck in February of 1947 when Rabbi Lieberman and his wife Sylvia were badly injured in a train crash. It would be three years before the Rabbi could resume his full duties. During that time, the lay leadership working with part time and interim rabbis kept our Temple functioning. Sanford Lazarus served as president for seven years providing stability and continuity. Our Religious School continued to grow and thrive under the direction of Blanche Feiman and her dedicated staff. The Sisterhood assumed all financial responsibility for the school.

As America entered the post-war boom, the McKinley Avenue Temple entered the "Big Move Era". This project was led by an extraordinary building committee: Louis Hoicowitz,

William Lavin, and Max Sachs. Their decision that the new building contain no plaques to indicate individual donors was never a deterrent to our members' generosity. This policy is still in effect today, yet over the years our building has been enhanced with outstanding gifts.

When the cornerstone was laid for the newly renamed Temple Israel in October 1952, the membership stood at two hundred eighty-seven families and our newly reorganized youth group had eighteen members. In 1953 High Holy Day services were held in our nearly completed sanctuary. Temple Israel was riding high. When Rabbi Lieberman resigned to serve another congregation our Board was once again faced with the challenge of finding a rabbi to lead us. In 1954, the search committee's unanimous choice, Rabbi Paul Gorin of Shaare Emeth Congregation in St. Louis arrived with his wife Dorothy and son David to begin what was to be a twenty-six year tenure as our rabbi. Once again our new Rabbi put his own stamp on our congregational life. Religious School was held on Saturday and Sunday as well as mid-week for Confirmation. Children were encouraged to attend our Community Hebrew School to prepare for bar and bat mitzvah. Sisterhood, Brotherhood, and Youth Group became integral parts of Temple Life. Family observances of the festivals, Shabbat and holiday dinners as well as adult study became a part of Temple life. Services were enhanced by a volunteer choir and a cantorial soloist.

Rabbi Gorin became a leader in Canton's civic and religious life. The Human Relations Council of Greater Canton was formed in 1965 due in large part to Rabbi Gorin's efforts and later he was named its Perma-

nent Executive Advisor and Honorary Life Member. In 1969 he received the "Award of Appreciation" from the Greater Canton Chamber of Commerce for his long years of service to the creation of a climate of understanding among the clergy and people of Canton. Temple's Men's Club became Temple Israel Brotherhood and increased its financial and educational activities within the Temple, as well as the Jewish Chautauqua Society. Brotherhood arranged to have a Jewish library presented to Walsh College and together with JCS established a chair of Jewish Learning with Rabbi Gorin as visiting lecturer. Wooster College received a similar gift.

When Principal Blanche Feiman retired due to failing health, the Temple established, in her honor, the Blanche Feiman Kallah. Its purpose was and still is to provide a scholar-in-residence for a weekend of study. With the retirement of Blanche Feiman, the school continued to flourish under the direction of Vivienne Grossman, Ellen Erlanger, and Bilha Ron.

In 1980 we were faced with yet another change when Rabbi Gorin needed to retire. Next month we will begin with our search for another spiritual leader.

**Chadash News**

**Classroom Notes**

At Chadash we use a Hebrew curriculum, called *Mitkadem*, that calls for the students to work independently once they've completed their initial instruction in the primer and have learned to decode Hebrew. At their own pace the students complete units, called *ramot*, that teach them the meaning of the prayers and that give them practice in reading or chanting the prayers fluently. They get assistance in their work from the teachers and from student aides who have completed the program. This school year we have started a new Hebrew reading readiness program in the 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> grade class. *Morah* Shankle (*morah* is Hebrew for teacher) comes by *Morah* Poole's classroom most Sundays and works with the students on Hebrew letter recognition. They've been having a lot of fun, learning some very useful mnemonic devices, such as that the letter *Tav* has a *T*oe! These students will be very well prepared when they begin their formal Hebrew instruction!

In their study of the biblical books of Prophets and Writings, the 6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> grade class has been reading a conventional age-appropriate textbook containing the stories, but they've also been reading the stories in play form, from a book called Bible Scenes. The skits preserve the basic plots of the biblical stories, but tell the stories in a somewhat whimsical, fun way. Later in the year the students will have the opportunity to perform one or more of these skits for the other classes.

The *Beit Midrash* classes (8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grades) have been studying the ancient history of the Jewish people with Bill Shankle and comparative religion with Rabbi Spitzer, which included visits to area churches. The 10<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmation class has also been working with Rabbi Adland on a comprehensive review of Jewish belief and practice.

The community *shlichim*, Tohar and Ofri, have visited all of the classes this fall and have introduced themselves to the students in wonderful presentations that have also taught the students a lot about Israel. Tohar and Ofri also participated in our Cha-

dash community Sukkot program, and will be involved in future Chadash holiday celebrations as well.
