## A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

First, after a meeting held in January at the Habitat for Humanity headquarters on Raff Rd., a couple of changes were made to our partners and building dates. Before I tell you about this, let me share that Sheryl White, Mark Atleson and John Spera are co-chairing this project. In advance, let me thank them for their leadership in recruiting workers as well as support people who will help with the hospitality. Also, let me state emphatically that this project is open to anyone age 14 and over, but there are stipulations:

- 14+ working on sites when power tools are not in use (graveling, tarring/bracing and painting);
- 16+ - working on sites when power tools are in use;
- 18+ - to work on the roof.

BOTH MEN AND WOMEN CAN BE A PART OF THIS PROJECT. No skill level is necessary. There will be raking gravel to hammering nails to adding plywood to the roof to painting. There is something for everyone to do.

THE CHANGES—the only partners in this project will be St Paul's Episcopal Church and the Islamic Society of Northeast Ohio. The other church that was to help has decided not to do this. Also, the build will begin in July and finish by the end of September at the latest (probably earlier.) Our site is at 2414 25<sup>th</sup> St NE. While we are building our home, there will be two other homes being built on adjacent lots. This is very exciting.

Finally, you will be receiving a letter from me in March asking for financial support for this project. Please help us raise our goal of \$12,500. Your generosity is always appreciated.

Mid-February Sandy and I will be leading a trip to Israel. This will be the seventh tour we have led. It is always very exciting to see Israel through the eyes of people who have never been before. There are 19 people going of which 14 are from Temple Israel. We are going to spend a bit more time in the Negev and the Dead Sea area than I have in recent trips and a bit less time in Tel Aviv. On Shabbat, we will join with Kol Haneshama in Jerusalem and after dinner with the group Christ Church Presbyterian that Rabbi Spitzer is helping to lead. Up north we will go to the Golan and in Sefat spend time with a Kabbalah Artist. And, of course, time for shopping in Jerusalem and Sefat. My hope is to do another tour in a couple of years, but designed as a trip for 2<sup>nd</sup> Timers, meaning that we don't necessarily go to places like Masada or the traditional stops in Jerusalem, but see **things that first trips to Israel can't always take in. I will write more about this trip in the April bulletin.**
