## A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

It is time to vote in the World Zionist Congress elections. I can only urge you to vote for ARZA—Association of Reform Zionists of America. Here is the link to go and vote [www.reformjews4israel.org/vote](http://www.reformjews4israel.org/vote). It does cost \$10 for those 30 and over and \$5 if you are between 18-30. You must be Jewish to vote. Once you click on the link or copy it into your browser, there is nothing to it. Why vote? Read this from the ARZA website:

*Right now, the American Zionist Movement (AZM) is holding elections to determine US Jewish representation to the World Zionist Congress (WZC), the highest legislative body of the World Zionist Organization (WZO). The WZO provides a forum for all the world's Jews to come together and deliberate about issues affecting both Diaspora Jews and the state of affairs in Israel. 145 seats in the Congress are dedicated to the AZM. The composition of the Congress has both financial and policy implications in Israel, as resources are directed to recipients in Israel based on the power each party holds within the Congress, and the policy positions of those parties. In short, these elections are the strongest way for American Reform Jews to promote and encourage the ideals of justice, equality and democracy in Israel itself and help build the kind of Jewish state we all know is possible.*

Here are the three pillars that ARZA is positioning itself on:

### Women's Rights & Gender Equality

We strive to create a world in which gender equality is the rule – where men and women can pray, work and live together as equals deserving of the same respect and honor.

### Religious Equality

We envision and work for a society in which all denominations are treated fairly and with respect – and all of us are seen as Jews, regardless of our level of observance.

**From the President**

In 1999 the Canton Jewish Community Federation, Temple Israel, and Shaaray Torah Synagogue entered into a dialogue to discuss a new paradigm for our community. The first issue tackled was how best to educate our children. We had the model of our Community Hebrew School which had been very successful, and building on that model we were able to establish Chadash in the fall of 2005. We reached agreement on religious issues, that respected the needs of the children from both congregations. A mission statement was created which reflected the importance of cultural and religious education and would teach a variety of Jewish experiences. Julie Katz was hired by both the Temple and Shaaray Torah to administer this new joint venture.

The Kadima Committee continued to discuss how to merge both congregations and the Federation into one building. After long discussions and many studies it was decided to sell both the Jewish Center and Temple Israel and move into Shaaray Torah. The money from the sale of Temple would be used to finance the remodeling of Shaaray Torah. Our concept of three separate entities sharing one space was so innovative that we received numerous inquiries from across the country asking for details. Temple Israel and the Jewish Center were sold to Malone University and everything seemed to be falling into place. However, after the downturn of 2008, Malone decided against purchasing the Jewish Center. As a consequence the building that ultimately became Beit Ha'am was downsized. This was one of those times when having less money to work with was to our advantage. Beit Ha 'am is perfect for the size of our community. When we walked our Torahs into Beit Ha'am in July of 2012 there was a sense of pride and accomplishment in our new spiritual home.

As had happened in the past, Temple Israel was once again faced with a beloved Rabbi's retirement. In 2008, after 27 years of service, Rabbi Spitzer was retiring. A search committee was formed and Rabbi Leah Herz was hired. Rabbi Herz left for a community in Florida and in 2011 Rabbi Jon Adland became the spiritual leader of Temple Israel. He and his wife Sandy moved to Canton in July of 2011 and immediately had a positive impact on our Temple family and the larger Jewish community. His interfaith activities and communal work serve us well in carrying on the traditions of his predecessors. Rabbi's stories, warmth, and humor have added to our Shabbat

worship experience. Sandy's love of Judaism and her involvement in Chadash and Sisterhood at a national level is an inspiration to us all.

Shortly after Rabbi Adland was hired, Julie Katz left Chadash and Nancy Shimer was hired as her replacement. Chadash continues to do an excellent job of educating our children.

Our congregation is 130 years old and we are faced with pressing questions. "Where do we go from here?" "What are our needs and wants?" "Who will be our lay leaders?" "Where will we get the funds to keep our Jewish institutions running?" "Are we here just for your spiritual needs?" "Do you look to the Temple for educational and social programs?" The answers to these questions will help shape our future. The most important question is who will lead us. We need people who are interested in serving on the board and who will step up and be the future presidents, treasurers, and secretaries of Temple Israel. In the spring we will have a leadership development seminar. Watch the Bulletin for information. I wish I could predict the future, but I do not have a crystal ball. My hope and prayer is that we will be able to meet the needs of all our members in the years to come.

"Why," you may ask, "is there a chuppah in the lobby?" It is there so that the community can see this one-of-a-kind work of art that was crafted in honor of Rabbi Spitzer's retirement. Completed in time for the wedding of Jodee Spera and Dan Haber in 2010, the chuppah project was made possible through the generosity of The Temple Israel Sisterhood, The Temple Israel Board of Trustees and two private donors who wish to remain anonymous.

- Design detail and hand-painting of each panel: Needlepoint Artist Debbie Forsythe of Art•Werks

**Chuppah Fun Facts:**

- The idea for a hand-crafted Chuppah came from Rabbi Spitzer when during Adam Schweitzer's 1997 Bar Mitzvah he asked if Shelley had begun stitching a Chuppah now that the tallit bag project was complete
  - It took one year to design and three years to stitch the Chuppah
  - There are 36 different colors and thread textures in each floral border
- Stitching time: approximately one hour per square inch (you do the math)
