A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

The Temple Ritual Practice Committee made two major decisions at the November meeting. First, the committee decided to make permanent the Erev Shabbat service time at 6:15 PM regardless of whether it is summer or winter, first Friday or fifth. There may be a few exceptions made for special Friday nights. This new schedule will begin February 3, 2017. Second, after a small taste of the new High Holy Day Mahzor—Mishkan Hanefesh—by using supplements at last year's High Holy Days, the committee decided to purchase the new Mahzor and to begin using it this coming fall. Let me now explain what all of this means.

Over the last few years, we have gone to an early Kabbalat Shabbat service beginning in late May until just after the High Holy Days. An Oneg Shabbat preceded these 6 PM services. (Our Temple President Shelley Schweitzer is working with some Temple members to redesign what we serve at the Oneg.) The service would last about an hour, sometimes a bit longer and sometimes a bit less. After the service was over, many people would go out to dinner and continue the Shabbat fellowship. To be honest, service attendance improved with the 6 PM service. When we returned to the 7:30 PM service during the late fall, winter and spring, service attendance diminished. As I said, this has been the case for a few years and it was obvious about the number coming early versus late. Thus, the committee decided to move the Friday evening Shabbat service time to 6:15 PM (for some 6 PM was hard to get to on time) for all services. The time won't vary depending on the season. Please note that this doesn't begin until February 3, 2017.

I am hoping that this new and permanent service time will allow us the opportunity on occasion to hold a Temple Shabbat dinner after services. Maybe these dinners will include a short time for study or maybe a movie with a Jewish theme or maybe some other interesting and unique idea. PLEASE NOTE THE NEW TIME!

Over the last several years, the Reform Jewish movement through the CCAR (Central Conference of American Rabbis) in partnership with the ACC (American Conference of Cantors) has been working on a new Mahzor for the High Holy Days. There are many reasons that initiated this work including the dated language in the Gates of Repentance as well as the lack of gender sensitivity, a terrible afternoon service, a desire for more liturgy that speaks to our hearts and souls, and more. The work toward this Mahzor took years. Drafts were written and tested and rewritten. One service at a time was brought into the 21st century. In 2015, Reform Jewish congregations purchased and began using the new Mahzor. Last summer I finally bought a set of the new Mahzor. (It is a set of two books—gold for Rosh Hashanah and silver/gray for Yom Kippur.) As I turned from page to page I realized that this book was an incredible masterpiece. I asked the CCAR for permission to create a few supplements to give Temple Israel a taste of this book and was told to go ahead. I tried to choose a variety of readings and the feedback I got from you was very positive.

Mishkan Hanefesh is laid out like our Shabbat Mishkan T'filah using the two-page spread. There are notes at the bottom of the page, study sections and short essays located throughout the book, and transliteration of the Hebrew. It will take some work to coordinate the Mahzor with our current music, but that is my goal. After 30 years of the red Gates of Repentance, it is time for us to take our next High Holy Day liturgical step forward.

To offer people an opportunity to get acquainted with Mishkan Hanefesh, I am going to offer several learning opportunities. I am calling this "Conversation with Mishkan Hanefesh." The dates are: Feb. 15, Mar. 15, April 5, April 26, and May 17. On Feb. 15, we will look at the Erev Rosh Hashanah service. On March 15, we will view the Rosh Hashanah morning service. On April 5, we will look at Kol Nidre. On April 26, we will consider the Yom Kippur morning service. And finally on May 17, we will look at the afternoon service, Yizkor and Neilah. These study sessions will begin at 7 PM and last about 90 minutes.

I am very excited about these changes and hope you take advantage of the coming early Shabbat services and the opportunities to learn about the new Mahzor.

A Message from The President

Who remembers the booming, rich voice of the Rev. Gregory Palmer? The stories of growing up Black in Canton, Ohio shared by Marilyn Thomas Jones and by Kimberle Williams Crenshaw? The story of unlikely friends – Vietnam POW cell-mates Fred Cherry and Porter Halyburton as told by author James Hirsch in his book Two Souls Indivisible? Think of the music, the messages, the Shabbat evenings we've shared with a community united in honoring the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. and all for which he stood.

It has been more than three decades now that Temple Israel has honored Rev. King's memory with a celebration of diversity and of our collective commitment to the values of human and civil rights. Our MLK Shabbat is the oldest, on-going commemoration of Rev. King in the White community. "We were first," Rabbi Spitzer noted when he and I took a stroll down memory lane recently.

As we prepare to remember the Rev. MLK at our annual Shabbat on January 13, I am reminded that it is also a celebration of our Temple family and of the Greater Stark County community. We are all indeed *B'zelem Eloheim*, created in God's Image. We are more the same than we are different, and each year, our speakers remind me of this.

Of course, we do not reserve just one day to think of the teachings and lessons learned from those who have inspired us. Throughout the year, not just on their *yahrzeit*...or in this case, a birthday, we remember them and live their legacy. Our annual worship has made a positive difference in our community.

When Ron Ponder was set to speak, he and Rabbi Spitzer were discussing his topic. Coincidentally, President Clinton was hosting a town-hall meeting in Akron at the same time. "Wouldn't it be neat if there were on-going town hall meetings," Rabbi mused. And so, Rabbi and Ron determined that race relations was a topic that needed to be addressed here in Stark County and the Stark County Town Hall on Race Relations was born. This group eventually morphed into Coming Together Stark County and many from the original committee remain involved in this group that continues to make an impact in our community. Through their efforts, Canton is a safer, kinder place to live. Thank you Frank and Barbara z"l Fleisher, Lois and Marty Jacobson, Martha Lottman z"l and Rabbis Spitzer and Adland who have dedicated many years and hours to this effort.

Many things have grown out of our MLK Shabbat and the relationships that have resulted. Those who were there in the beginning will recall the sound of our Sabbath when the Rev. George Dunwoody z"l brought his choir to the Temple. Their sound was bigger than life and in some ways, so was George. A gentle giant, he was telling us about the children who had no safe place to be during the summer when school was out. Many had no food and there were no safe places for them to grow and play.

And so, The Seventh Street Heaven Day Camp was born. With a committee from the church, Temple member Leon Albert z"l who brought the resources of Stark State to the table, Rabbi Spitzer and I worked to establish a Summer camp program that was housed at a Seventh Street church. For several summers the children had a day-camp experience that included field trips and crafts; music and outdoor activities and fun and games all bookended by three square meals a day (including those sent home to be enjoyed by everyone in their household).

It's been about 30 years since Canton hosted a Freedom March where we peacefully walked down Market Avenue alongside Coretta Scott King and other stalwarts of the civil rights movement. Our own Rabbi Spitzer chaired that historic occasion which brought generations of our community together in solidarity and remembrance - reminding all that we are, in fact, created *B'tzelem Eloheim*.

This year, when we celebrate the lessons of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., pause for a moment to think about the legacy of the man and of the Temple Israel commemoration. Thank you to all who have turned these messages into action and made a lasting impact on our community.

The Honorable Thomas M. Bernabei, Mayor of the City of Canton, is our guest speaker for Temple Israel's Annual MLK Shabbat Service on Friday, January 13, 2017, at 7:30 p.m, with a special Oneg following.

Thomas M. Bernabei is Mayor of the City of Canton, Ohio. He was elected in 2015 and is currently in his first term.

Mayor Bernabei is a lifelong resident of Stark County and lives in Canton, Ohio. He is a 1964 graduate of Canton Lehman High School. He graduated from Brown University in 1968 and the Ohio State University School College of Law in 1975. Between college and law school, Mayor Bernabei served four years in the United States Army, including one tour of duty in Vietnam.

Mayor Bernabei entered public service as Assistant Prosecutor in Massillon Municipal Court. He later served as an Assistant Law Director in Canton and was elected Canton Law Director in 1989. After retiring from the Law Department in 2000, Mayor Bernabei was elected to Canton City Council and served one term as Councilman-at-Large. He subsequently worked as Director of Public Service in Canton from 2008 to 2009 and as SARTA's interim Executive Director in 2009. Mayor Bernabei was elected Stark County Commissioner and served from 2010 – 2015.

Mayor Bernabei proudly practiced law with his father, Joseph, from 1975 to 1989. He is married to Bebe, a Canton Central Catholic High School graduate. They have three daughters and five grandchildren.
