A Message from The President

Temple Israel has registered for Synagogue Connect. Synagogue Connect is a project initiated by Rabbis Ronald N. Brown and Charles Klein for the purposes of reaching out to the many unaffiliated college students in America.

Synagogue Connect is working with the Jewish fraternity, Alpha Epsilon Pi, to create a list of synagogues which will open their doors (at no charge) to college students for the High Holy Days. These students, who may come from unaffiliated families, can then choose a synagogue of their choice to attend. Beyond that is the hope of Synagogue Connect that this gesture might encourage an ongoing connection between college students, synagogues, and rabbis.

Any college student wishing to attend services will be asked to contact the synagogue beforehand and bring his or her college ID for admission.

This can be a powerful message to Jewish youth that synagogue doors are, and will always be, open to them.

Chadash June/July 2016

A Revamped Judaics Curriculum at Chadash

Nancy has been working this past year, and will be continuing to work over the summer, with many of the Chadash staff members on revamping the Judaics curriculum in time for the 2016-2017 school year. While we are proud of the existing educational program here at Chadash, we know that there is always room for improvement, and so we are putting together a curriculum that will make the best use of our resources, will be more fun and engaging for the students than ever before, and will lead to even better outcomes in terms of the mastery of the skills and information that we expect from our students.

This curriculum will be loosely modeled after the Mitkadem Hebrew curriculum that we have used very successfully in the school for many years now. Mitkadem is an independent study-based curriculum, consisting of 23 units that the students work through consecutively at their own pace. Sometimes the students work on their own, and sometimes they partner with one or more of their fellow students on particular activities. In addition, students can always get assistance from the teachers or from classroom aides. Students must complete all the work for each unit and pass both written and oral reading tests before moving on to the next unit. The new Judaics curriculum will follow roughly the same model, although with more group activities, including interaction with students in different grade levels. Post-Confirmation students will be offered the opportunity to serve as aides and in-class mentors to the younger students.

The curriculum will focus on experiential activities, including regular art projects, music, skits, cooking, games, and “field trips” both inside and outside the Beit Ha’am building. At the same time we will create a vibrant, holistic Jewish environment in the entire school wing, including seasonally-appropriate decorations, depictions of important Jewish figures throughout history, models and dioramas of important Jewish locations and events, detailed time lines, and ritual objects.

All of the units and activities in the revamped curriculum will have at their core very specific educational competencies that we will expect the students to have mastered by the end of their work on the unit, and this knowledge and these skills will be regularly reinforced throughout the students’ years at Chadash. As with the Mitkadem Hebrew curriculum, teachers will be assessing the students’ mastery of those competencies along the way to ensure that the goals are met.

We are very excited about the revamped curriculum, and we can’t wait for the opportunity to introduce the students to it in the fall! HABITAT FOR HUMANITY INTERFAITH BUILD SUMMER 2016—JULY 23-OCTOBER 29

As most of you know, Temple Israel is building a Habitat for Humanity home with St. Paul's Episcopal Church (downtown) and the Islamic Community of Canton. The ground breaking/dedication is July 17, at 2 pm. The address of the build is 2414 25th St. NE.

The work commences on July 23rd. All the work will be done on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. The work times are listed with the dates. The first two work days are from 8:30-12 noon. The rest of the days are from 8:30-2:30. If you sign up, you are expected to be there the whole time. There is a devotional at 10 and lunch at noon. **We are asking that people only sign up for two dates initially in order to allow as many Temple Israel workers as possible to register. If we find a shortage by late June or early July, we will let you know.**

Volunteering is to be done online by going to Interfaithbuild.Habitateco.org. Click on Volunteer. Select a date next to Temple Israel and then click next. Because we are sharing this build, we are only allotted a certain number of workers for each building day.
