A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

As many of you are aware, these coming High Holy Days will find us using the new Reform Jewish *mahzor* (the Hebrew word for a holy day prayerbook). This *mahzor* is called Mishkan HaNefesh. (*Mishkan* is a tent or tabernacle and *Nefesh* is the word for soul.) This *mahzor* is modeled on the two-page spread like Mishkan T'fillah that we use at our Shabbat service with the right-hand page containing the Hebrew, transliteration, and faithful translation and the left-hand page containing readings with the theme of the right-hand page. There are insightful footnotes and many study pages located throughout the *mahzor*. I truly think that everyone will find an elevated pathway into the High Holy Day prayers and the ultimate meaning of this holy season.

One of the challenges of this text is actually deciding what to read at the exclusion of something else and what to skip in order to keep the length of the service reasonable. I am telling you now and will tell you again on Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur that I made my best guess, but fine tuning this is a work in progress.

I have two asks of you for help with this service. One of the additions to this service is beginning the Erev Rosh HaShanah service with the sound of the shofar. Just as we end the Neilah service at Yom Kippur with the sound of the shofar, so too we can begin the holy days in a similar fashion. I am hoping that our shofar sounders of Rabbi Spitzer and Linda Simon-Mietus will continue their tradition on Rosh HaShanah morning and that Rabbi Spitzer and Sandy Adland will sound the final blast of the shofar on Yom Kippur. I am looking for someone new, if possible, to do a Tekiah G'dolah at the beginning of Rosh HaShanah. So, if you have a shofar and would like to volunteer, please contact me at temple so we can set up a time to hear your tekiah.

On Yom Kippur at the afternoon service, we will read a section titled *middot-values*. There are 14 *middot*. I am inviting temple members to volunteer to be one of these readers. The passage is not too long and in English. If you want to be one of the readers, please let me know and later this summer I will give you your part.

It is early to start thinking about September, but I am very excited about these High Holy Days and anxious to get started. I hope to hear from you and certainly look forward to seeing you.

A Message from The President

I have thought a lot recently about the passage of time. It's been a year since I became President of the Temple; time really does fly. I am well aware of the fact that I have had the privilege of serving at a time when it is relatively easy to be President. I am surrounded by a Board that is thoughtful, attentive, and passionate about the items that come before us. I am embraced by a Temple family who speaks up and brings items to my attention in deliberate and respectful ways.

We have a Rabbi and a Rabbi Emeritus who are partners and role models for clergy the world over. We have healthy relationships with our Jewish community partners including The Canton Jewish Community Federation, Jewish Family Service, Shaaray Torah, and Agudas Achim. We have a community school where our children and families are inspired, and we have meaningful and joyful communal and Temple celebrations of life cycle events and holidays. We will begin with the meeting at 5:45 p.m. (no pre-service oneg that week) and continue with services immediately following at approximately 6:15 p.m. Following the service, we will enjoy Shabbat dinner and a brief program about some of the leaders on whose shoulders we stand: Meet Leo Abt, first president of Temple Israel.

Please come and participate in the election of new board members and join me in thanking those who are completing their term(s). Outgoing Treasurer Greg Luntz has spent years working with our bookkeeper and accountant to be sure that our finances are not just in order, but equally easy to access and understand. Secretary Joan Ortman has also served two complete terms and must now go off the board. Thanks to Joan, our history is preserved and our activities documented. Their guidance and wisdom as members of the executive committee is much appreciated.

Also completing their tenure on the Board are Eli Edelson, who has been working on our Endowment reporting tools and resources; work he will continue even after his Board service ends in July, and Howard Wernow, who will continue to serve as our legal counsel when he moves into an appointed position on the Board as president of our Brotherhood. Brotherhood President Paul Garfinkle will rotate off the board when his Brotherhood term ends. Paul chaired our Religious Practice Committee, which recommended a number of changes for our Temple, including a new High Holy Day Prayer Book and a 6:15 p.m. Shabbat service start time.

As I reflect on this past year and think about the strides that we have made and the things we've been able to maintain, I am most proud of the way that we continue to come together for so many things: to celebrate, to mourn, to learn, to pray, to laugh, to argue, to remember. Thank you for continuing to put your trust in me as your president. It continues to be an honor.

We're in for a treat July 27 and 28, when actor/musician Anita Hollander and her family will bring their unique blend of music to our Shabbat worship on Friday, July 28. Watch for information about this special musical Shabbat and about Anita's performance of her one-woman show, *Still Standing*, on Thursday, July 27, at 7 p.m. at Beit Ha'am, which is being presented by the Mort November Fund of the Canton Jewish Community Federation in conjunction with the Temple.

A cancer survivor who lost her leg to the disease, Anita is, among other things, a composer of Jewish music and often serves as soloist at The Village Temple in NY. Her siblings, who will join her on the bimah Friday evening, are often on the bimah of Anshe Chesed Fairmount Temple in Cleveland.

On Thursday, bring your friends and enjoy learning Anita's journey through story and song. The Kennedy Center presented Anita's original one-woman musical "*Still Standing: A Musical Survival Guide for Life's Catastrophes*," which won the Audience Award at the United Solo Theatre Festival in NYC and has garnered critical praise and awards from the New York Times, ASCAP, Billboard, and Back Stage Magazine, for writing as well as performance. *Still Standing* has been presented at The White House, Off-Broadway, Disney World, and throughout the country.

A Cleveland native, Anita is the daughter of Iris November and Cantor Bernard R. Hollander z"l. She is also a stepdaughter of Mort November z"l, whose bequest to our community makes it possible to bring programs such as this to Canton.

Mark your calendar for both of these special evenings. Anita's daughter, Holland Hamilton, will also join us for worship Friday evening. You won't want to miss this talented family that is as generous of heart as they are talented. *Still Standing* is open to the community as is the workshop that Anita will offer on Friday morning on welcoming people with disabilities.
