A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

What an incredible month we have before us. We start with “Kreplach and Dim Sum” with cantorial soloist Robyn Helzner on Sunday morning March 1 (RSVP to the Temple for this one and there is a small charge.) On March 13, Rabbi Eric Yoffie, president emeritus of the Union for Reform Judaism will speak at the Erev Shabbat service on the topic, “Liberal Judaism in America.” On March 27th, at the Erev Shabbat service, Dr. Gali Tibon will speak on behalf of ARZA—The Association of Reform Zionists of America. Dr. Tibon is the Founder and CEO of the Institute for Zionist education through the Humanities.

Lest we think that is all for March, we will also celebrate Purim with Chadash on March 4 and an adult celebration on March 7. There is a Jewish Chatauqua program with Charita Goshay on March 8. Lexi Cooper will celebrate her Bat Mitzvah on March 13 & 14. On March 20th at the Erev Shabbat service we will celebrate Chadash Shabbat. I know I must be missing some other things, but suffice it to say March is going to be an incredibly busy month.

A little more about the three programs in the first paragraph:

In addition to her concerts and recordings of Jewish music, Cantorial Soloist Robyn Helzner has a unique connection to the Jewish communities in Asia. Robyn officiated at the first bar mitzvah celebrated in Beijing, China, and served as the Cantor for the United Jewish Congregation of Hong Kong. Through her lively multi-media presentation, Robyn shares stories, photos, video and music to explore the extraordinary history of the Jewish communities in Beijing, Hong Kong, Shanghai and Kaifeng; and traces their emergence as the fastest growing Jewish region in the world, today.

Rabbi Eric H. Yoffie is the president emeritus of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ), the congregational arm of the Reform Jewish Movement in North America. The URJ represents 1.5 million Reform Jews in more than 800 synagogues across the United States and Canada. Installed as president in June 1996, Rabbi Yoffie led the Reform Movement in exciting new directions, moving congregational life toward greater attention to Torah study and adult literacy.

In his writings in recent years in *The Huffington Post* and *Time*, Rabbi Yoffie has addressed matters of belief and spirituality as they impact Americans of all faiths and of no faith. He has been an articulate advocate for a modern and thoughtful approach to American religious life. He has applied his progressive religious point of view, rooted in Biblical text and religious teaching, to issues of sin, atheism, and community as well as contemporary matters such as immigration, health care and gun control.

Dr. Gali Tibon is the Founder and CEO of the Institute for Zionist education through the Humanities - The Institute aims to strengthen the nature, image and values of the Zionist State of Israel in the spirit of the Declaration of Independence; a state that ensures complete equality to all its inhabitants, and whose values embody tolerance, openness, progressiveness and fairness.

Dr. Tibon is a member of the "Lochamei Hageataot" Ghetto fighters' museum board and head of the educational committee. (Lochamei Hageataot is in our Western Galilee Partnership Area.) Dr. Tibon comes to us from Tel Aviv where she is an active member of Beit Daniel, a thriving Reform community in the Israel Movement for Reform and Progressive Judaism.
