A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

In February, our one Confirmation student, Joel Mostov, participated in the Union for Reform Judaism's Religious Action Center's incredible teen program titled "L'Taken: A Social Justice Seminar." Along with the fabulous URJ camps, which Joel went to as well, this teen program, attended mainly by Confirmation students from across the country, is one of the other great teen program opportunities. Over the last few years only a few of our Confirmation students have taken advantage of participation in "L'Taken." One, Noah Barat, was so enthused by the program he asked to go a second time. I am thrilled to have chaperoned Joel to this one.

So what happens at "L'Taken" that makes it so incredible? From Friday evening at Shabbat through Sunday evening the students (there could be as many as 250 at the program which is run about 6 times a year) immerse themselves into Reform Judaism's commitment to social justice. The students learn about different issues, role play a number of scenarios, go in depth on topics of their choice, and begin to prepare for the culminating activity on Monday morning: Lobby Day. On Lobby Day, these 250 Jewish students, go up to Capitol Hill to their senators' and congress people's office. They sit down with legislative aids and present their lobbying points of view.

I was very proud that Joel wanted to go to D.C. and participate in L'Taken. He was the only student from a congregation that only sent one student. Eventually we connected with Congregation Beth Tikvah, located in the Columbus, area and its three students. When it came time to prepare for the lobbying experience on Sunday evening, the students split into groups and lobbied on positions advocated by the URJ. There were several choices to choose from and our small, but mighty, band of students chose to address the Refugee and Immigration question and LGBTQ rights. With material supplied by the RAC, the students wrote speeches which are approved by the RAC staff. On Monday morning, students wearing their finest (Joel in a nice suit and tie) went first to Senator Portman's office and then to Senator Brown's office. After lunch our group split up and Joel and I went to Rep. Renacci's office. At each place we were met by a legislative aid to whom the students read their prepared remarks. I have to say that at Sen. Brown's office, three legislative aids met with us and asked questions and responded to the lobbying.

Until you see a young 15/16 year old take charge like this, you don't always understand what they are capable of doing. Joel was poised, read extremely well, and represented Temple Israel, Chadash, and the URJ quite well. I just sit there and smile.

Hopefully we can do this again next year. This trip can be life altering for the students in how they see themselves participating in our governmental system. For me, it gives me faith in the future.

A Message from The President

I am struggling. And I suspect I am not alone. I am struggling to find ways to balance my responsibility to find and use my individual voice with my responsibility to represent a diverse constituency both as President of Temple Israel and in my role as executive director of Women's Impact, Inc, a women's professional organization that counts among its members, politicians and advocates of all causes on all sides.

I am struggling with disrespect and intolerance that becomes evident when people with juxtaposed positions are not able to engage in a respectful discourse. I am struggling with how to articulate those things about which I am passionate and remain open to the views of those whose passions are opposite my own.

What I know is that silence is not an option. When we are silent – regardless of the topic on which we are expressing our views – we are abdicating our rights and responsibilities. A 2014 article from Inc. 5000 notes that we must set the greater good as the priority and speak to it – whatever you believe that to be. It goes on to say that when you speak, you demonstrate your personal investment/caring about the topic, and you may have information to offer that others don't have. Finally, it is likely that you are not alone in your thinking. "By speaking your mind, you encourage others to voice their opinions as well. If everyone holds back, the bus may silently head over a cliff," the article says.

We Jews are not known for "holding back," or for agreeing for that matter. In fact, according to the Torah, we *kvetched* the whole time we were wandering through the desert. (And we are still here to complain thousands of years later).

In Genesis, we are reminded that we are all created in God's Image and that unlike animals who act mainly on instinct, we have been given the privilege and responsibility that comes with free will. When we take action, we take on the consequences of those actions whether they produce the desired outcome or a less desired one.

Please, decide to take action – to speak up and speak out. And please, when you agree to disagree, remember that these are the sounds of a democracy and each of us has a right and responsibility to advocate for what we believe. While I may be struggling, I also celebrate the diversity of our Temple family and am enriched by the conversations, even when I find myself at a different place. Thank you for your passion and commitment.

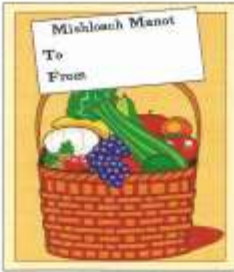
