A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

Confirmation this year will be on Sunday morning, May 3, 2015, beginning at 10:30 a.m., which is also the last Sunday morning of Religious School for this calendar year. By having it on the last Sunday of Religious School we tie this culminating educational experience to Religious School. By having the entire Chadash community, as well as anyone else who'd like to attend and celebrate with our three confirmands, we demonstrate to everyone how important and significant this celebration is. Many children (and even adults) have no idea what Confirmation is and we want our students to continue studying beyond their bar or bat mitzvah celebration.

For many years and in many congregations Confirmation is traditionally held on Shavuot as we tie the giving of the Torah to the maturation and commitment of our confirmands to Judaism and Jewish life. Over the years in the Reform movement as bar and bat mitzvah became more popular the position of Confirmation diminished and we found the only people attending the ceremony were family and friends. (I remember that my Confirmation was truly a congregational affair.) I believe that all of us should be present to acknowledge and thank the students who are completing their formal Jewish education: Michael Adelman, Alex Slattery, and Jacob Weiner. Hopefully the Chadash students who are in the lower grades will witness this moment and set their sights on their confirmations some day.

At the recent ritual practice committee, led by Eli Edelson, a significant decision was made as to when we will observe Yizkor and Simchat Torah. After some deliberation, we have decided to move Yizkor from 10 a.m. in the morning on the days it is held to 5:30 p.m. the evening before. (Because Shavuot is over Memorial Day weekend we will observe Yizkor at the Shabbat preceding Shavuot this year.) At the last Yizkor we observed at the end of Pesach no one came. I am hoping that by making this a bit more convenient than in the morning, more of you will take advantage of the opportunity to remember loved ones in a spiritual setting.

Finally, as we continue to find ways to engage more people in our Jewish celebrations we are now going to celebrate Simchat Torah on the nearest Shabbat during Sukkot. We will frame the Torah reading and

it a relevant document for our Temple in the years to come.

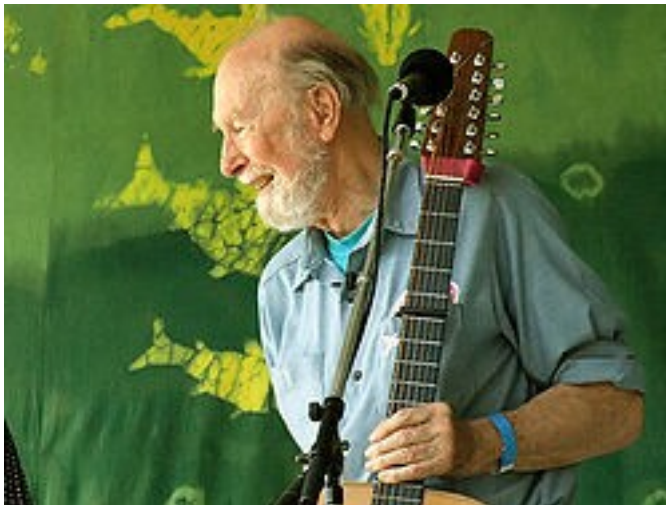
Joyce Ortman, Long Range and Board Development Chair, and her entire committee did an outstanding job in bringing Stephen Gordon here this past Sunday.

P. J. Wells will portray Seeger and Charita Goshay will join him as a storyteller, revealing the singer’s life and times.

Wells began his singing career with folk and folk/rock music in college, with Pete Seeger being a continued favorite for him through the years.

Pete and his music showed that, although he loved his country, he was not afraid to sing about what he thought would make it better. He was a key figure in the folk music movements from the 30’s to the 60’s. He and his music made you love your country; however, at the time he was attacked for his beliefs and was censored from performing some of his material on television.

Music is included that everyone remembers and can sing along with, but also some that may not be so well known—and should be.

Charita, well known for her writing skills and many awards, will reveal details of Seeger’s life throughout the program. “Pete Seeger is more than a musician; he’s an American hero whose story deserves to be told. As someone who loves history, I was honored at the invitation to be a part of it.” A former Cabaret production that featured Charita in a storytelling role was about singer, Hank Williams.

Ofri's dad was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina and made Aliyah with his family to Kibbutz Gaash in 1965. He is an accomplished professional with international experience. He speaks: Hebrew, English, Portuguese and Spanish.
