Let me do the asking right up front: We need people to help work the garden, which means planting, weeding, and harvesting. We need people to do the veggie chopping. All of us get together about 1.5 hours early to get the tables set, turn the ovens on, heat the food, and then wait for the guests to arrive. On her behalf, we are looking for more people other than the usual suspects who help with this dinner time after time. We are serving four dinners a year: the Sunday before Christmas, Easter, and two others. If you can give up three hours on a Sunday afternoon once or twice a year, I'd appreciate this so much. Now that we have our Kabbalat Shabbat service regularly at 6:15, we are working on some Shabbat dinners. If you'd like to volunteer to help coordinate one of these dinners, please be in contact with the Temple office.

A Message from The President

Remember the 1960's Breck shampoo commercials that instructed us to lather, rinse, and repeat? As I move through the Jewish year, I am reminded of the refrain. We Jews are a people who continually lather, rinse, and repeat with the emphasis on repeat.

The Jewish year, while complicated by adherence to the lunar calendar, allows us, and in fact requires us, to re-live, commemorate, remember, and celebrate the same events over and over; to consider and contemplate the messages of these events and to live the core values and commandments articulated in the Torah, the commentary and all of the teachings of Judaism.

Recently, I saw an interview with Abigail Pogrebin, author of [My Jewish Year: 18 Holidays, One Wondering Jew](#). A Reform Jew, Ms. Pogrebin embarked on a personal journey to try to better understand the why behind Jewish observance, commemoration and repetition. At this writing, I've just begun reading about Ms. Pogrebin's year; however, the idea of her journey has sparked in me a desire to try to educate myself more about why we Jews do what we do.

I have always found the rhythm of the Jewish year comforting. I tell time by the Jewish holidays (even though the time changes annually). With the arrival of Pesach is the arrival of spring. (Some test smoke alarm batteries when the clocks are changed; at my house, we know they work when we cook for Passover and Rosh Hashanah). As we approach Shavuot, I know that the end of the school year approaches and summer is on the way.

Most of us know that Shavuot commemorates our receipt of the Ten Commandments; we can envision the Jewish people standing at Sinai. We may know that we eat dairy and those truly observant study all night. (At Temple, for those who choose to mark the holiday, we will have a dairy dinner and study earlier in the evening on May 30 at 6 pm.)

In the 50 days between Pesach (the barley harvest) and Shavuot (the wheat harvest) we count the omer and observe two modern Jewish holidays: Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day and Yom Ha'atzmaut, celebrating Israel's Independence.

I am always moved by the stories of the Holocaust and by the fight for independence. I worry that those of us who never lived in a time before there was a Jewish homeland, or who have not had the opportunity to hear the first-hand accounts of the Holocaust, will relegate these moments from modern history to the routine observance of lather, rinse and repeat.

So, for me, I have a renewed commitment to trying to understand the whys behind what we do and to recognize how the experience changes each year as I repeat the traditions and observances that fill my Jewish year. In many ways, I am on auto-pilot as I "lather, rinse, and repeat" the planning, preparation and execution of each holiday; this year, inspired by Abigail Pogrebin, I am challenging myself to think more about the relevance today of each occasion, and the way that my family and I choose to mark it.

Perhaps you would like to do the same. For starters, see if you can name 18 holidays (not counting 52 weeks of Shabbat). Rabbi and I got to 16 when we put our heads together.
