**A Message from The President**

Do you remember the first time you voted in a national election? I turned 18 in 1973, so I was not old enough to vote in the '72 presidential election. My brother turned 18 the summer of 1976, the same year that I turned 21, so despite the ratification of the 26<sup>th</sup> amendment to lower the voting age in July 1971, it worked out that we both became eligible to vote in a presidential election the same year.

I must have come home from college to cast my ballot, because I remember the family walking together to Mason school, our alma mater and our polling place. It was at Mason where we'd studied American history and learned about the evolution of voting laws, the Suffragette Movement, and Jim Crow.

From our parents, our Temple leaders, and our youth group peers, we learned the importance of participating in the political process -- of educating ourselves, of listening, questioning and speaking to those things that would impact our lives, of casting our vote.

Members of Temple Israel typically have access to the voting booth and I hope that all who are eligible will make the choice to exercise this right. Not all are as fortunate. As I noted in my Rosh Hashanah remarks, the Temple Israel board voted at its September meeting to "Stand Up for Voter Protection and Participation" by becoming a *Nitzavim* Congregation. This non-partisan initiative of the Reform Movement's Religious Action Center, is a nation-wide effort to ensure voter access to all, regardless of race, age or economic status.

I never had to fight to cast my ballot; although I sometimes think about the fact that my mother-in-law and grandmothers were born before women and people of color could vote. It's hard to imagine an election without television or radio and someday people will wonder how a campaign worked before social media.

One thing hasn't changed. It is both a privilege and a responsibility to vote. In Babylonian times, Rabbi Yitzhak taught that "A ruler is not to be appointed unless the community is first consulted." It's our time to consult. If you need assistance getting to your polling location; if you'd like to volunteer to take others to the polls or to get a state-issued identification card, please call the Temple office.

During the first weekend of November, Sandy Adland will complete her two-year term as Central District president. Temple Israel congratulates Sandy on her two years of leadership. The WRJ Central District Nominating Committee is proud to announce that Sandy Adland will assume the position of Immediate Past President of the Women of Reform Judaism Central District Board of Trustees. Her term will be November 2016, until November 2018. Mazal Tov to Sandy Adland. May you go from strength to strength.

**Chadash Students Send Rosh Hashanah Cards to Windsor**

As part of the new Judaics curriculum, students worked with teachers Linda Poole, Danya Morris, and Hannah Roberts to make beautiful Rosh Hashanah cards for the Jewish residents at the Windsor assisted living facility. The students discussed some of the different traditional greetings for the High Holy Day period, practiced saying the greetings, and wrote them on their cards in English and in Hebrew. Nancy delivered the cards to Windsor before the holidays, where they were greatly appreciated!

**Special Sukkot, Hoshanna Rabbah, and Simchat Torah Activities**

On Sunday, October 16, the Beit Midrash (8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade) students helped Ellen and Bill Shankle build and decorate their home sukkah and had a yummy snack and a lively discussion in the completed sukkah. The younger Chadash students made sukkah decorations and helped to decorate the community sukkah here at Beit Ha'am. In addition, they made their own model lulavim and etrogim so they could practice the traditional "waving" of the lulav before going into the sukkah and fulfilling the mitzvah of saying the brachot (blessings) and waving the real lulav and etrog! Those students who attend Hebrew class on Wednesdays were also able to go out to the sukkah to have a special holiday snack on October 19, in fulfillment of the mitzvah to "dwell" in the sukkah.

On Sunday, October 23, as part of celebrating Hoshanna Rabbah with Hazzan Braun and the Shaaray Torah morning minyan, the students participated in the traditional beating of the willow branches. Rabbi Adland then took out a Sefer Torah (Torah scroll) and unrolled the entire scroll so that the students could see the complete Torah and identify particular well-known passages. The students then created their own "illustrated Torah" scroll. Finally, they got to plant flower bulbs near the bench on the Beit Ha'am grounds.

The entire community is invited to attend the Consecration service on Sunday, November 20, as we formally welcome our youngest students to our school and celebrate the beginning of their lifetime of Jewish learning! The time is to be determined, but will be sometime in the morning during school hours. Watch for more details!

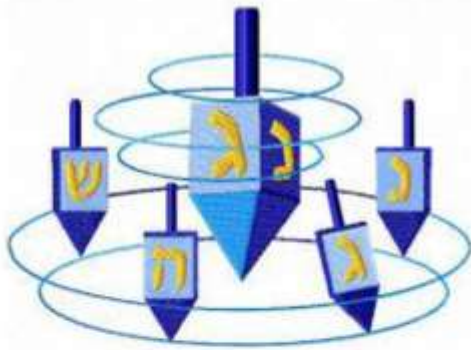

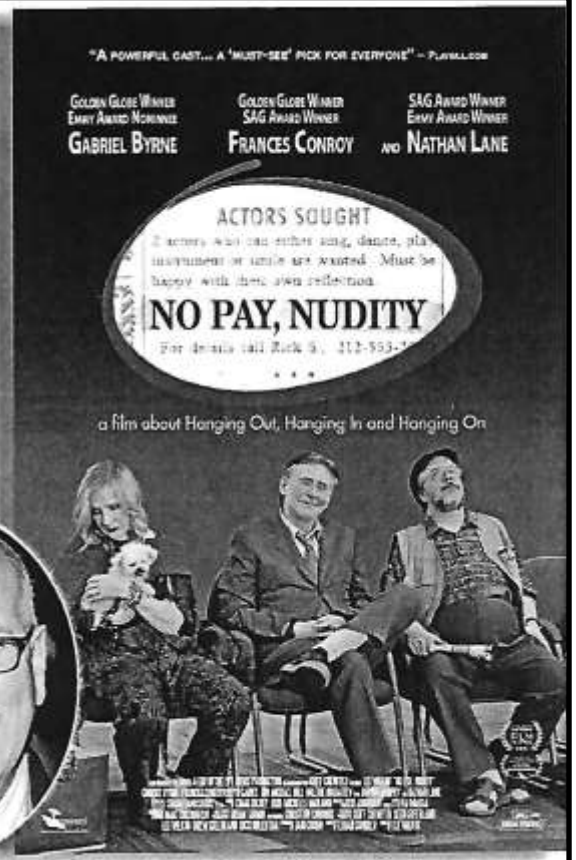
