A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

Sukkot is certainly one of the most uplifting holy days on the Jewish calendar. It is a time to remember our journey in the desert on the way from Egypt to the Promised Land. During that journey we lived in sukkot, a temporary dwelling that could easily be packed up and moved on to the next location. Today, we continue to remember what our ancestors did by building a sukkah in our own backyards. Some of us eat in them and some of us may even sleep in them. Regardless, celebrating this ancient festival is a great thing to do.

Sukkot is also our annual harvest festival. During the days when our Temple stood in Jerusalem, we were commanded to bring the fruits of our harvest in a basket and present them to the priest. During the Second Temple period, this seven-day festival was the most important festival of the year, even more important than Pesach. People would come to Jerusalem, erect a sukkah and spend seven days dancing and celebrating the end of the harvest season.

Some people think that Sukkot is the American Thanksgiving. They believe that the Christian community used Sukkot as its model, but harvest festivals are popular in all religions and cultures so there is no evidence to the truth of this.

This year at noon on Sunday, October 12, during Sukkot we are going to celebrate our harvest from our Gan Bracha by initiating the next phase in our garden's evolution. Rev. Anissa Glaser Bacon and members of New Vision Church UCC, which is located on Market just north of 30th Street, will join anyone who is interested for a lunch under the sukkah to talk about the process of making this an inter-faith garden. The meeting, which will last from noon-1 p.m., will take a look at growing, harvesting and working to feed the hungry in our Canton community. Our hope is to enlarge our garden and plant more food to feed those in need. To accomplish this we need help and this church wants to help.

Basic Judaism & Introduction to Hebrew Classes

Beginning the end of October on Thursday evenings, Rabbi Adland will offer two classes: Basic Judaism and Introduction to Hebrew. Both classes will begin on October 30. The Basic Judaism class will have 12 sessions and the Introduction to Hebrew class will run for twenty-two sessions.

Basic Judaism will begin at 6:30 p.m. and conclude at 7:25 p.m. This class is designed to paint broad strokes of living a Jewish life and what a Jew believes. It is a wonderful beginner's course or a refresher for those who can't remember what they learned in religious school. The cost for this class is \$40 which covers the texts used.

Introduction to Hebrew will begin at 7:30 p.m. and conclude at 8:30 p.m. This class will take the Hebrew novice from knowing no Hebrew or just a little to being able to read many of our regularly used Hebrew prayers, as well as the meaning of some of the words. The cost for this class is \$35 which covers the texts used.

Dates for both classes are: October 30; November 6, 13, and 20; December 4, 11, and 18; January 8, 15, 22, and 29; and February 5. The Hebrew class will continue meeting at 6:30 p.m. on February 26; March 5, 19, and 26; April 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30; and May 7. If you choose to enroll in both, then the cost for both is only \$65. Jewish Family Service Seminar beginning October 26th

Jewish family services, in collaboration with Temple Israel, Shaaray Torah and Agudas Achim, is planning a 3 week seminar that hopefully will continue next year. We are titling it Health Education Programs, but it is really about " what you'd like to know about growing older but nobody ever tells you". It is similar to the elusive manual for parenting and now we have the "how to take care of aging parents" (our spouses or ourselves). This seminar will introduce you to topics that are extremely important but not readily talked about. We want these sessions to be very informative and be open for lots of question and answers. You may attend one, two or all three talks. Bagels and coffee will be available.

We are scheduling 3 topics over three weeks and if there is an interest, we have many other topics to start in January. The initial three topics include mental health issues in the older adult, what are advanced directives and palliative care and lastly, what you need to know about power of attorney, guardianship and living wills from a lawyer's perspective.

A geriatric psychiatrist will help to differentiate various symptoms expressed such as sadness, apathy, lack of

motivation , energy and memory loss. Many symptoms overlap and not all memory loss is Alzheimer's dementia. A palliative care doctor will help in the understanding of choices people have in directing their own health care. Understanding the topic of advanced care planning will allow for a more productive and useful discussion with your doctor.

A lawyer will provide an education on the legal issues around estate planning .

For this series , we are willing to help with transportation if needed. Please contact Heather Hershey-Tompkins or Chelle Cohen if needed. Call Jewish Family services at 330-445-2402 or 330-445-2850, by Wednesday the week of the talk.

JFS plans to work with the Area Agency on Aging to look at home care services and our clergy to discuss end of life issues as well as a number of other important topics, if people are engaged in the program.

Our first session will be on October 26th at 9:45 am and continue for the following two weeks. Please join us as we explore many challenging and relevant topics for many members of our community.
