A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

It wasn't all that long ago, 2013, that we were talking about how the High Holy Days were beginning so early in September. Here we are in 2016 talking about how late the High Holy Days are to be this year. Of course, the High Holy Days always come on time, but that time is based on the moon and lunar calendar, not the sun or solar calendar. I've never actually figured out when is "on time" for the holy days, but I can guarantee that this year is late!

All of the holy days fall in October this year. Though most of us just think about Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, the festival of Sukkot begins on October 16 and lasts for a week. We have moved the celebration of Simchat Torah to a Friday night and that will happen at Temple on October 21st, beginning at 7:30 pm. A number of Temple members will be reading from the Torah and if you'd like to read a verse or two let me know soon.

Many people talk about the good old days when the sanctuary was filled all the way back to the stage. Though I never experienced it here in Canton, I did see this in my previous congregations. In Lexington, we'd have to have two shifts of services because the sanctuary couldn't be expanded. People would arrive early to get "their" seats. Somewhere in the last few years of my time in Lexington, we cut out the second Rosh Hashanah evening service because people weren't coming to that service anymore and we could combine the two populations into one. The same thing in Indianapolis. Then I noticed that we weren't always full Yom Kippur morning and then the population was thinning out for Yizkor. Where were the people?

When I grew up, you went to the evening and morning services on both of the holy days. It is what you did and were expected to do. Now people come to one or two of those services and feel like they've done their religious duty. Hearing the sound of the shofar on Rosh Hashanah morning or standing for Kol Nidre was less important than just getting to a few of the services. Maybe it is the way of the world, but these new rules are getting harder for me to get used to in my life.

As a student, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur were days NOT spent in school. You went to services and stayed home. Unfortunately, for whatever the reason or pressure, many of our students are going to school on these days. I will be honest, this makes me sad. When did it happen that students couldn't miss a couple of days of school to honor and observe the holiest days in their faith community? The times they are a changin', but I don't have to like it. The holy days are a time to be a part of the Jewish community in prayer, special meals, and family.

I look forward to seeing you at temple in October. At this time, on behalf of Sandy, Josh and Karen, Rachel and Evan, let me wish you a Shana Tova u'metukah—A Happy and Sweet New Year.
