A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

September is the month when life in Jewish communities around the world begins to intensify with excitement and energy. Last year it was at the beginning of September, but, as we all know, the Jewish calendar moves around and this year Rosh Hashanah doesn't start until near the end of September. As I write this in August, we are already making the necessary preparation for our Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, which are followed by Sukkot/Simchat Torah. The fall in general and the Hebrew month of Tishri in particular are very busy for all of us.

For me, soon I will begin to write my messages for these special days. Our choir will soon begin rehearsals to add to the beauty and depth of the Holy Days. Many of you will bring out family recipes, gather with friends, and share traditions that are filled with depth and meaning. I love this time of year and look forward to sharing the Holy Days with all of you.

I want to share an experience I had at the end of July in York Harbor, ME. I was privileged to officiate at my first same-sex wedding. One of the brides was a young woman who I had known from my days in the bluegrass state. I had officiated at her bat mitzvah and her confirmation ceremonies. The family of three girls and two wonderful parents had been devoted members to the congregation. When the youngest of the three girls asked me to officiate at her wedding I was thrilled, excited, and nervous. I had never officiated at a same-sex wedding and needed to do some work on my liturgy to make it appropriate. I reached out to my rabbinic community for help and was rewarded with extremely helpful responses. The wedding itself was beautiful. The setting overlooked the water. The brides were gorgeous. The families were happy. The ceremony was unremarkable as it was a Jewish ceremony with just a few changes to reflect the uniqueness of the moment.

Not all of you will agree with my position, but marriage is about love and commitment and shouldn't reflect the sexes. I have come a long

way on this journey to that moment, but felt so proud to be taking my place in history. The walls to this obstruction are tumbling and I don't see how the Supreme Court of the United States can do anything else but affirm the right of same-sex couples to marry. If a church or minister objects, then don't officiate or participate, but don't say to me that I can't affirm what I believe is moral and religiously upright. There is no justification to deny same-sex couples the right that heterosexual couples have enjoyed for millennium. The world is changing and I am happy to be a part of this change.

Basic Judaism & Introduction to Hebrew Classes

Beginning the end of October on Thursday evenings, Rabbi Adland will offer two classes: Basic Judaism and Introduction to Hebrew. Both classes will begin on October 30. The Basic Judaism class will have 12 sessions and the Introduction to Hebrew class will run for twenty-two sessions.

Basic Judaism will begin at 6:30 p.m. and conclude at 7:25 p.m. This class is designed to paint broad strokes of living a Jewish life and what a Jew believes. It is a wonderful beginner's course or a refresher for those who can't remember what they learned in religious school. The cost for this class is \$40 which covers the texts used.

Introduction to Hebrew will begin at 7:30 p.m. and conclude at 8:30 p.m. This class will take the Hebrew novice from knowing no Hebrew or just a little to being able to read many of our regularly used Hebrew prayers, as well as the meaning of some of the words. The cost for this class is \$35 which covers the texts used.

Dates for both classes are: October 30; November 6, 13, and 20; December 4, 11, and 18; January 8, 15, 22, and 29; and February 5. The Hebrew class will continue meeting at 6:30 p.m. on February 26; March 5, 19, and 26; April 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30; and May 7. If you choose to enroll in both, then the cost for both is only \$65. First Day of School: Sunday, September 7

On the first day of Chadash for the 2014-2015 school year, Sunday, September 7, all students should report to the main lobby of the Beit Ha'Am building no later than 9:30am; an all-school service will begin in the large sanctuary at 9:30, as usual. Students

will be dismissed with their teachers to their classrooms at the end of the service at 10:00. As always, parents are welcome to attend the Sunday morning service with their children. to attend the "regular" services in one of the two worship spaces.

Temple Israel Sisterhood will meet on Sunday, September 14 beginning at 9:45 a.m. All Temple women are invited to our light breakfast and brief business meeting. Following our meeting, Sisterhood Book Club will meet to discuss The Lost Wife.

Jewish Family Service Seminar beginning October 26th

Jewish family services in collaboration with Temple Israel, Shaaray Torah and Agudas Achim is planning a 3 week seminar that hopefully will continue next year. We are titling it Health Education Programs, but it is really about " what you'd like to know about growing older but nobody ever tells you". It is similar to the elusive manual for parenting and now we have the "how to take care of aging parents"(our spouses or ourselves). This seminar will introduce you to topics that are extremely important but not readily talked about. We want these sessions to be very informative and be open for lots of question and answers. You may attend one, two or all three talks. Bagels and coffee will be available.

We are scheduling 3 topics over three weeks and if there is an interest, we have many other topics to start in January. The initial three topics include mental health issues in the older adult, what are advanced directives, and palliative care and lastly, what you need to know about power of attorney, guardianship and living wills from a lawyers perspective.

A geriatric psychiatrist will help to differentiate various symptoms expressed such as sadness, apathy, lack of

motivation , energy and memory loss. Many symptoms overlap and not all memory loss is Alzheimer's dementia. A palliative care doctor with help in the understanding of choices people have in directing their own health care. Understanding the topic of advanced care planning will allow for a more productive and useful discussion with your doctor.

A lawyer will provide an education on the legal issues around estate planning .

For this series , we are willing to help with transportation if needed. Please contact Heather Hershey-Tompkins or Chelle Cohen if needed. Call Jewish Family services at 330 445-2402 or 330 445-2850, by Wednesday the week of the talk.

JFS plans to work with the Area Agency on Aging to look at home care services and our clergy to discuss end of life issues as well as a number of other important topics, if people are engaged in the program.

Our first session will be on October 26th at 9:45 am and continue for the following two weeks. Please join us as we explore many challenging and relevant topics for many members of our community.
