shaking the lulav and etrog. This will be followed by dinner, a “bonfire”, smores and singing. There will be room under the sukkah for some people to eat their burgers or hot dogs.

As I wrote earlier in the year, no one came to the Yizkor service at the end of Pesach. As a result, with the support of the ritual committee we made some changes to the schedule. We will observe Simchat Torah on the Friday evening during Sukkot. When possible, we will have a Yizkor service at 5 p.m. on the eve of the last day of the festival or we will have a Yizkor service as part of a Shabbat service. Hopefully, that will encourage more of you to attend these services. This year, Simchat Torah will be held on Friday evening, Oct. 2nd, at 6 p.m. We will have a short service, an unrolling of the Torah and many Torah readers to finish reading Deuteronomy and begin Genesis, and conclude with Yizkor/Kaddish. All of this will be followed by an Oneg Shabbat/Simchat Torah. If you haven't read a verse of Torah in the past and would like to read a verse this year, please contact me at Temple. It is a lot of fun and if you have any Hebrew skills at all it isn't hard.

I look forward to the upcoming Holy Days and to see all of our Temple community at the services.

The fall is always an exciting time, what with the High Holy Days, Sukkot, and Simchat Torah, and, of course, the beginning of school. We've planned an especially activity-filled year, with on-going games and competitions that everyone can participate in, and, most importantly, a lot of fun Jewish learning! Our goal is that next May, in 2016, every student will be able to look back on the school year just past and marvel at all the new Jewish skills and knowledge that he/she has acquired!

One Last Reminder: Chadash Registration Due for the 2015-2016 School Year

If you have not already done so, please be sure to get your child's registration from in to the Chadash office no later than Friday, Sept. 11, so that we have time to update our database by the first day of school. Again, since the registration form contains important medical information that we would need in the event of an emergency, it is

vital that we have an updated form for each student before the school year begins. If you have mislaid your forms, please call the Chadash office at (330) 445-2853 and we will send new ones to you, either by snail mail or by email.

First Day of Chadash: Sunday, September 20

On the first day of Chadash for the 2015-2016 school year, Sunday, September 20, all students in grades 1-10 should report to the main lobby of the Beit Ha'Am building no later than 9:30am; an all-school service (except for the PreKindergarten/Kindergarten class) will begin in the large sanctuary at 9:30, as usual. Students will be dismissed with their teachers to their classrooms at the end of the service, at 10:00. As always, parents are welcome to attend the Sunday morning service with their children. Parents of PreKindergarten/Kindergarten students should take their children directly to the PreK/K classroom at 9:30 – if those parents have older children and would like to attend the all-school service, they may drop their PreK/K child off at the classroom a little earlier than 9:30.

Last Reminder of Chadash Student-Led High Holy Day Services

Chadash students will lead services for their fellow students this year on Rosh HaShanah morning, Monday, September 14, at 11:00am, and again on Yom Kippur, Wednesday, September 23, at 11:30am (please note the different start times) in the library in the Beit Ha'Am building. This year students from our 7th, 8th and 9th grades will fill the roles of rabbi and cantor for each of the services, and younger students will be leading the English readings and some of the Hebrew prayers. Ellen Shankle, who has organized this year's services, will also be on hand to make sure everything runs smoothly. Please note that, while parents are welcome to attend these services, space is limited in the library, and in order to ensure that there are enough seats for all of the students, we encourage parents (especially parents of older students) to attend the "regular" services in one of the two worship spaces.

- Alvin Langer, MD, passed away on July 28, 2015, at the age of 80. Dr. Langer will be remembered as one of the founding fathers of the Northeastern Ohio Medical University, College of Medicine (NEOMED) Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, where he held the rank of Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology for 23 years. He also served as Associate Dean for Clinical Education for the Canton campus, as well as being Chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology from 1993 to 1999. Additionally, from 1976 to his retirement in 1999, he was highly regarded as the Academic Director of Ob/Gyn at Aultman Hospital and its residency director, and responsible for the training of many obstetricians and gynecologists across the country. He was a staunch supporter of women's reproductive rights. Throughout his career, Dr. Langer frequently cited and paid homage to his own teachers and mentors, and he in turn inspired many students to pursue a career in women's health. Al absolutely cherished his family. He died peacefully, surrounded by his wife of 53 years, Sheila, his two daughters and granddaughter, following a

short battle with pancreatic cancer.

Please be generous! The bags will be available on Rosh Hashanah, and you may bring them back on Yom Kippur.

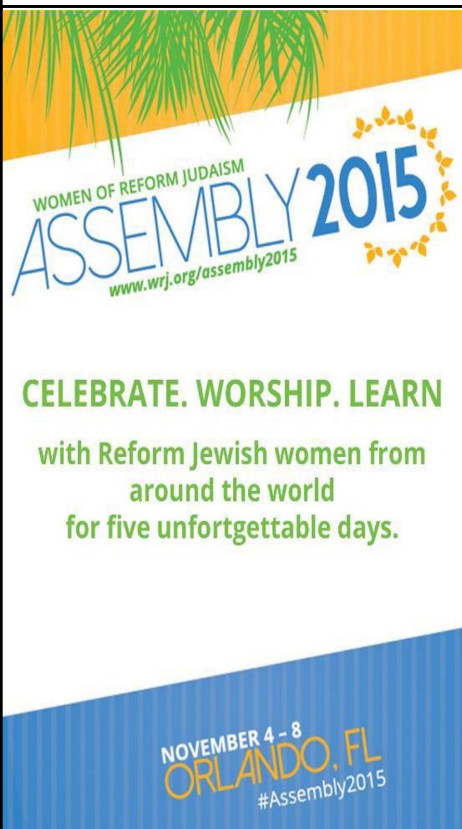
Sisterhood News

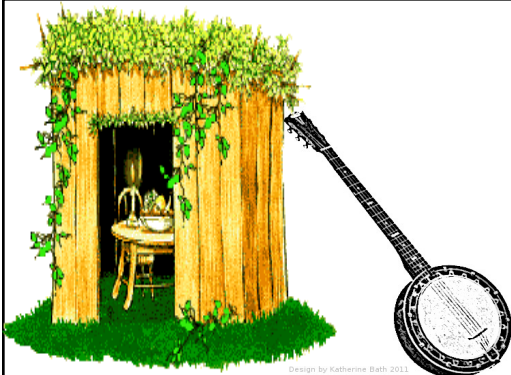
