A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

With the beginning of 2019 also begins my last six months of serving you as rabbi. It is not time to say goodbye, but I do want you to know that I will be dismantling my library that I have amassed since I was a rabbinical student in Cincinnati. As I moved from Lexington to Indianapolis, I downsized because the office bookshelves were smaller. When I arrived here, I didn't know exactly what space I would have so I downsized a little bit again. Now, as I prepare to move my library home, I know there won't be enough room to keep all my books. The Temple has agreed to let me use some of the library space for some of my books, but anything I put in there becomes property of Beit Ha'am. The books that I want to keep, I will box up and take home. There are many books that I purchased that I just don't need anymore. There will be a table in the foyer over by the library where I will place these books. They are yours for the taking. Most will be adult books, but there may be some children's books or story books as well. I just don't know. At some point, I will take what is left to the library for it to sell or discard. Please help yourselves.

Also, beginning on February 6, I will be offering a 10-session Introduction to Hebrew class. This is a very beginning class to teach people the letters and vowels, how to combine them into words, and learning to read some Hebrew prayers. The class dates are: 2/6, 27; 3/6, 13, 27; 4/3, 10, 17, 24; 5/8. The cost for the class is \$36. Please register by January 23. Any registrations after this date cannot guarantee that materials will be available for the first night.

Finally, on January 18th, we will celebrate our annual MLK Shabbat Service. If you remember last year, the service was cancelled due to an ice storm that descended on our fair city. Brenda Stevens, who was scheduled to speak last year, will be our speaker this year. This is always an amazing evening. Please mark your calendar and note that the service is at 7:15 pm, not our usual 6:15. The oneg will follow the service.

A Message from The President

The past few weeks have been an extremely busy and thought-provoking time at Temple Israel. We have met with our two Rabbinical candidates to replace the retiring Rabbi Adland. The search committee has been working diligently in this process, and with congregational input, will be making a decision shortly (possibly before this article is printed). Regardless, the planning and execution of the visits by our candidates was thorough and complete. I thank the search committee and the congregation for your interest and effort.

This month, we will once again host the Martin Luther King Shabbat on January 18th (weather permitting this year). Our MLK Shabbat committee has worked very hard to prepare for this event and hope many of you will be able to attend.

Most of us are familiar with the late Dr. King's work. He has many memorable quotes that we recall, i.e. "Free at last, Free at last, Thank God almighty we are free at last." There are many quotes which most of us don't recall, but pass the test of time. "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere." "We must learn to live together as brothers or perish together as fools." And life's most persistent and urgent question is, "What are you doing for others?" To this question we can answer with Tikkun-Olam.

To some, his assassination seems like ages ago. To others it seems like yesterday. As a high school senior, I can recall the shocking news on the evening of April 4th, 1968. On Sunday April 7th, Marcia Wilkof, Marsha Perlman (Reines), and I attended the Memorial service for Dr. Martin Luther King at the Canton Memorial Auditorium. We were representing the Canton Jewish Community Center.

This was my first real exposure to the cultural and social revolution of the 1960's. Although there is much work left to be done, his groundwork laid a path toward justice and equality. His deeds and actions cement his legacy.

Family Living Center Homeless Shelter

Thank you all for your generous donations for our room that we have sponsored. We have enough supplies for "starter kits" for the next family in our room for now. We will continue collecting full size shampoo, conditioner, soap, body wash, shaving cream, lotions, towels, wash cloths, blankets and sheets for a twin bed and full size bed. We would like to enhance our efforts for the shelter by collecting items that the shelter itself needs. They have a community kitchen which has a microwave, refrigerator, and a crock pot. There is no oven or stove. Therefore, all of the food items should be microwavable or "ready to eat".

The list they have suggested includes:

Cheerios, mini shredded wheat, cocoa puffs, mini boxes of cereal, cereal bars, granola bars, toaster pastry, pop tarts, jelly, juice boxes, chex mix, capri sun, waffles, fruit bars, microwavable frozen dinners, crackers, ramen noodles, pretzels, tuna, canned chicken, spaghetti o's, lunchables, easy mac n cheese, fruit snacks, and any healthy snacks.

General donations needed for the center include:

Housewares, coffee pots, can openers, toasters, dishes, bowls, cleaning supplies, feminine hygiene, baby items (diapers, wipes, shampoo, baby wash), trash bags, laundry detergent, dryer sheets, wastebaskets, lamps, laundry baskets, plastic storage containers.

We will start collecting items and bring them to the shelter. The other option is a cash donation and the shelter can buy Marc's gift certificates or Speedway gas cards. Items can be dropped off at the Temple, and the office will let me know. Thanks for your generosity.
