## A Message from Rabbi Jon Adland

Because I have to write these articles about half-way through the month, I didn't have a chance to reflect on the amazing MLK Shabbat. Thank you to all who organized the dinner for our speaker, the oneg, the singers, choreography—everything was great. Though our numbers continue to decline at the service, it was great to see a nice mix of community and Temple people in the sanctuary praying and singing together. Plans are starting to be made for next year's MLK Shabbat. It is never too early to mark your calendar for January 17, 2020.

We will not be building a Habitat home this summer, but it doesn't mean that Habitat opportunities don't exist. As I've written before, there is a group of Temple Israel members—the Habitat crew—who have spent the last couple of years going from home to home to hang doors, put up window trim and door trim, and do punch list items. (It depends on what is needed on the day we go.) There is certainly room for more volunteers to get on my list. Even if you only do it once, the experience is still great. More often than not, we work on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from 8:30-2:30. No skills are necessary, just a willingness to be present.

It won't be long until we start the spring planting in our community garden Gan Bracha. A number of Temple members already volunteer to plant, water, weed, and harvest, but there may be others who want to be a part of this magnificent interfaith project with New Vision United Church of Christ. You may only have to do this one time or one week, but it is an opportunity to participate in a great program whose bounty goes to feed those in need.

There are more programs on the horizon including Urban Ark dinners and a new one at Canton Calvary Mission. Lest we forget, in October/November the opportunity to participate in the Thanksgiving Baskets Downtown will be publicized in early October.

Finally, we are starting up a Social Action Committee again and are looking for people who want to sit on this committee, generate ideas, and do good work. Let the office know if you are interested.

**A Message from the President**

On January 27<sup>th</sup>, the congregation met and ratified the Rabbinic Search Committee and Temple Board of Trustees recommendation to hire Matthew Berger as our new Rabbi. Rabbi Berger will begin his duties July 1, 2019, replacing retiring Rabbi Jon Adland. We will welcome Rabbi Berger, his wife Ida and their two children,

**Making Shabbat Meaningful for Our Children**

The Chadash Shabbat service is taking place early this month, and this is a time for the Chadash students to share their learned Jewish knowledge with the community and their families. Our Chadash Shabbat service will highlight the prayers and rituals that have been taught in our curriculum, but in addition, this is a time for our families to share Shabbat together and to create meaningful moments for their own families.

Creating rituals at home adds to the family Shabbat experience. There are family recipes passed on from generation to generation, special table cloths and dishes, flowers picked from gardens, and perhaps some shared chores in preparation of the weekly meal.

Coming together as a community adds another layer to creating Shabbat meaning. At Chadash Shabbat, we share a meal before services together. Families can sit together, but we are among friends and being led in *Hamotzi* by our children. This time is special, and our menu this year reflects that. Instead of the Mac ‘n Cheese that has been served in previous years, this year we will celebrate with a traditional Shabbat menu of roasted chicken and veggies with a parve *Oneg* after the service.

We hope that the festive time together will generate good feeling and comfort as we then pray together and teach our children that Shabbat is meant to be shared. It is important for our children to know that not only do they have the love and support at home that helps them build traditions, but they also have this comfort from their Jewish community and especially within the walls of *Beit Ha’am*.

We hope that Chadash families will join us on Friday evening, March 8<sup>th</sup> for Chadash Shabbat, but we also hope that other members within the community will too, as our community is key in bringing meaning to Shabbat for our Jewish Canton children. 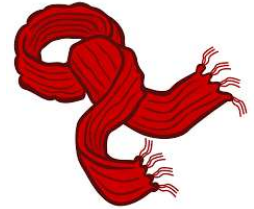
