The road ahead will be quite unsteady for a while. Whatever support our Temple Israel community can offer to the Berger family, we will.

As I said, we will be fine, but many of us may need to step up to fill in the gaps. I appreciate the support from our leadership that this won't affect my retirement plans, but please know that both Rabbi Spitzer and I will be here to support the Temple any way we can. **A Message from the President**

You received an email about a month ago explaining that Rabbi Berger and his family will not be moving to Canton this summer. Due to a family medical issue, the Berger's will remain in Texas. The Temple Israel congregation will keep the Berger family in

our prayers and their son, Avi, will remain on our Mi Shebeirach list.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup> the Temple Israel Board of Trustees met to discuss direction and strategy in moving forward. We will re-open our search for a new rabbi. The Rabbinic Search Committee has agreed to re-convene when any viable candidates are identified. The board has welcomed the return of the search committee under the chair of Shelley Schweitzer.

The Temple Israel Executive Committee, along with Rabbis Adland and Spitzer, will be putting together a plan to provide service and programming for the congregation if necessary. This will include everything from worship to life cycle events to community representation to providing direction for the office.

Life has many paths to follow. Occasionally there are detours. Some detours may create obstacles. Obstacles force choices to be made and create opportunity. This is an opportunity for our congregation. You may find that some aspects of Temple might be different. Embrace the opportunity. Day of Remembrance of the Holocaust

**Conrad Weiner**  
*Guest Speaker*

Conrad Weiner was born in 1938, in the small Romanian town of Bucovina (currently Ukraine). Romanian authorities, who worked in alliance with the German forces, began a massive campaign of deportation and annihilation of the Jewish population.

Bucovina’s Jews were taken by cattle car on a two day journey, before being forced on a two week march through the snow and mud to their final destination—Budi, a work camp. Conrad was only 3 1/2 years old at the time.

Please join us on May 1 at 7:00 p.m. to hear Mr. Weiner’s story of survival as part of Canton’s Remembrance of the Holocaust and the Heroism.



There will be memorial prayers and a candle-lighting in memory of the six million. Our clergy, our shaliach, Mor Roffe, Chadash students and students from Arts Academy at Summit School will also participate.
