## Guest Column, Shelley Schweitzer

If you are on Facebook, you've seen the meme that says "sometimes people come into your life for a moment, a day, or a lifetime. It matters not the time they spent with you but how they impacted your life in that time."

When the High Holy Days arrive at the end of September, Rabbi David S. Wolfman will enter the lives of Temple Israel congregants, and in that moment, I hope that you will all be positively impacted by his presence at this unique time in our congregation's history.

In the age of social media, it is easy to learn about an individual, and I encourage you to visit Rabbi Wolfman's website, <http://dswolfman.com/> to learn about his work. When you click on the testimonials tab, you will see over, and over, and over again that David is a well-respected man who is a *mensch* – a person of integrity.

I thought I would take this time to share with you some of the things that you won't find on David's website. David came into my life nearly 20 years ago when I began my tenure at the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ). At the time, David was Regional Director of the Boston-based Northeast Council. I was a Director of Youth and Informal Education in the Northeast Lakes Council (NELC) in Beachwood.

It was evident from the first moment that we were introduced that my work would be positively impacted by his welcoming ways, collaborative spirit, and genuine love and caring about people, social justice, and Reform Judaism. It didn't hurt that he is a musician with a love for Reform Jewish camping and youth group. His reputation preceded him, and his friendship with NELC Regional Director Rabbi Elliot Kleinman told me that this was going to be an important person for me to get to know.

What I could not anticipate then was the impact David would continue to have on me even after we each left our respective positions at the URJ. Through the years at the URJ, our responsibilities evolved and our opportunities to work together continued to change. Whether it was a staff gathering, a Biennial conference, a study weekend, or an office visit, David taught me by example and always left me laughing and feeling good about our efforts.

When I became assistant regional director (ARD), I asked to shadow David and his ARD. They welcomed me with open arms and spent several days focused on helping me learn the ropes. Ironically, eight years later – several years after David had left the URJ to do his consulting and transition work full time, it was David who I turned to again to help me navigate my first steps on my journey away from the URJ. Again, I spent several days in Boston – this time, as a guest of David and his wife Jane in their home.

**A Message from the President**

On June 21st, we held our Annual Congregational Board Meeting and Dinner. The focus of the meeting was to honor Rabbi Adland's service to Temple Israel. Although Rabbi Jon is retired, he will remain active in many social action and social justice programs. Please do not send him a rocking chair.

Officially, we are now in a state of transition. Our Board of Trustees has worked diligently in seeing that our day to day operations continue as normal. The office staff has been doing an excellent job maintaining the status quo. Friday evening Shabbat services are being led by different members each week. Please check the Temple communications sent regularly for the schedule of guest "Rabbi" for each service.

The Temple has hired Julie Zorn to be Director of Non-Rabbinic Duties and Director of Family Programming & Community Outreach. She will phase out of the former when a new rabbi is hired and become more active in family programming and community outreach at that time. She will continue as Chadash Director. We are fortunate to have her with us as we move forward. We welcome her to our Temple family.

In late June, the Social Justice Alliance (SJA), a newly formed committee, met for the first time. They selected 3 societal issues from a list of 12 recommended by the Religious Action Center (RAC) for Reform Judaism. They are Women's equality and reproductive rights, preventing the scourge of gun violence, and a humane and just immigration system/responding to the global refugee crisis.

The Temple has sponsored many social action programs over the years. These programs will continue as they typically provide goods and services to those in need. Social justice differs slightly as their goal is to reduce or eliminate the cause or source of the problem in the first place through advocacy and action.

The next SJA meeting is scheduled for August 13th at 7:00 p.m. Anyone is welcome to attend.
